Love your neighbour as yourself

Jesus said, ' You must love your neighbour as yourself.' Only when we accept ourselves as good, and begin to love ourselves, will we be able to start loving other people as the Lord commands us'.

Those filled with self-loathing, are not going to be able to love others. Usually they project their feeling onto others, blaming others for what they do not like in themselves.

An old man was sitting on a bench at the edge of town when a stranger approached. 'What are the people in this town like?' The stranger asked. 'What were they like in your last town?' Replied the old man.

' They were kind, generous, and would do anything for you if you were in trouble.'

' Well I think you will find them much the same in this town.'

A second stranger approached the old man asking the same question: ' What are the people in this town like?'

Again the old man replied ' what were they like in the town you have come from?'

' It was a terrible place,' came back the answer. ' To tell you the truth I was glad to get out of it. The people were mean, unkind, and nobody would lift a finger to help you if you were in trouble.'

' I'm afraid,' said the old man, ' you will find them the same in this town.'

The main point of this story is: We see people not as they are but as we are. If we see people in bad light, it is a sign that we are ill at ease with ourselves.

Unless we love ourselves we cannot love others properly. So to begin with we must love ourselves. But if we love ourselves in the wrong way, then we become incapable of loving anyone else.

There is an idea that love of self is wrong, even sinful. There is, of course, a form of self-love which is wrong. We call it selfishness or egoism. But there is a form of self-love which is healthy and good, and without which we cannot really love others.

You can't fly without wings. We can't offer warmth to others if our own fireplace is cold and empty. We can only love with the amount of love that is in us. Whether we are conscious of it or not, we do love others precisely as we love ourselves.

It is very important, then, to have a healthy love and respect for ourselves. This is where love starts, but of course it is not meant to end there. All true love of self overflows in the form of love of others and of God.

It is easy to love certain people because they are loveable. But not so easy to love others who are clearly flawed. But that is the real test of love. Where there is no love, sow love, and you will reap love. Where there is no love, put love, and you will find love.

Love is patient and kind always ready to excuse to trust and to endure whatever comes love does not come to an end.
Love your neighbour as you love yourself.
