The Gift of Love - More important than Sacrifice

The Film Les Misérables, is the story of a man by the name of Jean Valjean. Valjean had just escaped from prison after 19 years. He was a bitter man having been sentenced to jail for stealing a loaf of bread to feed his sisters family. Valjean to avoid re-capture moved in the darkness of the night. Knocking on a door, a kindly bishop invites him into his house, offering him a meal and a bed.

When Valjean dined, the bishop insisted on putting his finest silver plates, used only for special guests, out on the table. During the night Valjean woke, stole the bishops silver plates and sneaked out of the house. The police soon caught him. He lied about the silver plates, saying the bishop gave them to him as a gift. The police took him back to the bishop's house with the stolen goods. When the bishop saw Valjean he declared that he was glad to see him because he wanted to give him the silver candlesticks as well. The police had no choice but to let him go.

This amazing act of forgiveness and mercy made such a deep impression on Valjean that he was transformed into a new person who spent the rest of his life serving others and showing them mercy.

Jesus said that the two greatest commandments were: that we should love our God with our whole heart....and that we should love our neighbour as ourselves. The scribe agreeing fully with Jesus went further 'This is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice'.

In other words love of God and loving service to our neighbour are more important than elaborate cult. This would have endeared the scribe to Jesus because he himself had said (quoting Hosea 6:6) 'What I want is mercy not sacrifice'. To offer sacrifice is a great thing. But to show mercy to a fellow human being - often there is no payback, especially when the person involved deserves to be punished (as in Valjean's case), especially when it is in our power to punish him.

One thing should be a big help to us, namely, the conviction that we ourselves stand in daily need of God's mercy. We should always remember the words of Jesus 'Blessed are the merciful; they shall have mercy shown them.'

It is sad we would all agree - to find people of faith devoid of any warm attribute of compassion for others. When a true disciple combines true faith and warm compassion, you have a powerful combination. Here you have true holiness.

God acts generously towards people who have not earned nor deserved his generosity. God shows us grace and mercy when we least deserve it, and like Valjean when we really experience it we are transformed.

There used to be a great number of priests, under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.'

Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God'. And after that no one dared to question him any more.
