SENDING OUT SEVENTY-TWO DISCIPLES

Jesus sent out his disciples as bearers of peace, healing and the good news of salvation to others. In our turn as disciples we are to be bearers of peace!

When Jesus sent out the seventy-two disciples he said their first words on entering a house were to be : 'Peace be to this house.' They were to be ambassadors of peace and goodwill. Without peace nothing is possible. The thought that we as disciples of Christ are to be ambassadors of peace and goodwill is a worthy thought indeed.

So many negative words and thoughts can divide and distance us from each other – it is important we nurture through our prayers the words of Jesus the desire that as his disciples we be ambassadors for peace.

Peace is not a negative thing. Peace implies openness, friendship, tolerance, goodwill, hospitality and reconciliation. It strengthens us to reach out to others. It helps us break down barriers of suspicion, fear, bigotry and prejudice.

Very soon young ones from amongst us will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation - through their families, schools and Parish they are learning about the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the fruits of the Holy Spirit, praying to receive these gifts so as to better live their call to be disciples of the Lord.

July 21st is not too far away now and to have the whole parish totally at one with them in their journey will be one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit alive and vibrant in our Parish. Please do pray for them, even if you do not know their names. Embrace them as your brothers and sisters in Christ – their stories are displayed on the notice board in the Annex - please take time to read them.

Shortly before Communion the priest says to us, 'The peace of the Lord be with you always.' Then he or the Deacon at the Mass invites us to 'offer each other the sign of peace.' The hand we reach out to our neighbours is the same hand with which we receive Jesus in communion.

The end of the Mass is not like the end of an AFL football game or film where we simply get up and leave. We are Sent Out. Having received the peace of Christ, we are sent out as ambassadors of the peace to others - in this way we are 'Glorifying the Lord by our Lives.'

May the Lord's peace be with you always.

GOSPEL:

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'
