## Fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year C 13 - 14 July 2019

#### A CALL TO BE CARERS

This weekend we hear again the great parable of the Good Samaritan. (Luke 10:25-37). In this parable Jesus tells us that God wants us to care for one another. Two religious people such as the Priest and the Levite in this story, stand judged for neglecting to help a wounded man they were lacking in compassion. Yet, Religion without compassion is a contradiction.

At the start of the story we know little about the priest, the Levite, and the Samaritan. At the end we still don't know much about them. Yet we know more about the Samaritan, who being so compassionate put the person in need first. Sadly, when the crunch came for the priest and the Levite, they put themselves first. The priest and the Levite were guilty of the sin of omission.

Sins of omission may be our worst sins, yet wrongly, we think that as long as we don't do harm to anyone we are okay. Could it be true that some of us have watched others being hurt and not intervened on his/her behalf? There are people who stay clean by distancing themselves from anyone in trouble? The Samaritan was a carer.

I have had the privilege of witnessing many carers throughout my priestly life. For over forty-five years I have marvelled at so many who take communion to the sick, who pick up fellow parishioners to bring them to Mass, who serve so tirelessly in St Vincent de Paul, the soup kitchen, AA meetings, who visit the lonely, who serve in the many service groups throughout our parish, the Family Groups, the RCIA, Teachers, visitors to the hospitals and the aged care.

I believe that carers are very special people. They are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. They don't care out of a sense of duty. They care because their heart will not allow them to do otherwise.

Each of us is called to be a carer – for each of us has a wonderful capacity to care, to share and to dare. Small opportunities to care come our way every day. It's within our power to say a kind word, to offer a little word of compassion and give sympathy, to give our support. Just as the good Samaritan poured 'oil and wine' on the wounds of that wounded man. We know there are the little drops of 'oil and wine' which we can apply to take some of the pain out of a wound.

The extent of our virtue is determined, not by what we do in extraordinary circumstances, but by our normal behaviour.

#### Reflection: Beatitude for Carers

The good Samaritan was someone who cared. Blessed are those who care: they will let people know they are loved. Blessed are those who are gentle: they will help people to grow. Blessed are those who listen: they will lighten many a burden.

Blessed are those who know how to let go; they will have the joy of seeing people find themselves. Blessed are those who, when nothing can be done or said, do not walk away, but remain to provide a comforting and supportive presence: they will help the sufferer to bear the unbearable.

Blessed are those who give without hope of return: they will give people an experience of God.

May we in our Parish, home and workplace offer Love, Care and Healing to one and all.

But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?'
