Twenty-fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year C 21 - 22 September 2019

As my time in the Cathedral Parish of Sale comes to an end, I sincerely thank the whole parish community for your love, support and prayers during my diaconate placement here for the last year. It has been a privilege for me to work for the people of God in Sale by being part of the life of every one of you, in one way or the other.

I would also like to express my sincere thanks to Dean Peter Bickley and Fr Edwin Ogbuka for their support and guidance during my time of preparation for the priestly ministry in the Diocese of Sale.

As most of you are aware, I am a Syro Malabar Catholic by birth and baptism. The Holy Catholic Church consists of 24 Rites (Liturgical Traditions) and Syro Malabar rite is one among them. Each of these Churches is of Apostolic Succession and professes the Catholic Faith in its entirety.

From the first community of Jerusalem till today, the entire Church celebrates the single Paschal Mystery of Christ. However, over the centuries, according to the culture and tradition of a land and through foreign influences, this mystery embraced diverse liturgical forms for its celebration. Moreover, the mystery of Christ is so unfathomably rich that it cannot be exhausted by its expression in any single liturgical tradition. So, as the Faith grew, these 24 rites developed, and the history of the blossoming and development of these rites witnessed to a remarkable fullness and complementarity.

When these Churches (rites) live their respective liturgical traditions in the Communion of the faith and the Sacraments of the faith, they enrich one another and grow in fidelity to the Tradition and to the common mission of the whole Church. With this goal in mind, The Holy See encourages each of these 24 rites to be faithful to its rich Traditions so that as the time goes on, the wholeness and the richness of these Traditions are not lost nor diluted. As a result, a Syro Malabar catholic is required to receive (unless with special permission from the Holy See) all the sacraments (including the Holy Orders) to guard, preserve and to keep this Sacred Deposit of Faith alive in future years. This is the reason why I need to receive my Priestly Ordination in the Syro Malabar Rite by a bishop who also belongs to this rite. (And, I had a special dispensation given to me by the Holy See to be ordained a deacon by Bishop Patrick O' Regan in September last year).

Once again, I sincerely express my deep gratitude to all of you for being part of my journey to the priesthood. As I return to Kerala, India for the final preparations, please continue to support me with your prayers so that I may be given the grace and gifts of the Holy Spirit to be a priest after the heart of the High Priest, Jesus Christ.

For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and – I am telling the truth and no lie – a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans. In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

'The master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light.

'And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity. The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own? 'No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.'
