Sharing our powerlessness November the month of all souls

Jesus saw that Jerusalem was heading for destruction. He foresaw that the magnificent Temple would be reduced to a pile of rubble. To the everyday Jew this was unthinkable. The Temple symbolized the entire Jewish system of worship.

Jesus' prophecy came true to the letter. Jerusalem was destroyed by the Romans in the year 70 AD. The Temple was burned to the ground. Jesus dearly wanted to save Jerusalem, but was unable to do so. Once with tears in his eyes he said 'Jerusalem, Jerusalem! I longed to gather your children to myself, as a hen gathers her chickens under her wings, but you refused.'

Many have experienced how terrible it is to be at the bedside of a family member, a friend who is suffering or dying, and not be able to save him/her. We feel inadequate. Powerless. It is comforting to know that Jesus shared our powerlessness. He felt like we do. Like Jesus we didn't walk away – our ministry is simple presence, difficult we know, it is precious and vital. Like Mary at the foot of the cross, we stay with the suffering or dying person. A reassuring supportive presence can mean the world to the sufferer.

As I look daily at our Cross of remembrance at the front of the Cathedral and read the many names of loved ones written on a heart I image many standing supporting their loved ones, with a sense of helplessness, relieving pain and fear through the great bond developed between them. Spending long nights, sleeping alongside loved ones praying with their priests and responding to any cry for help.

I have witnessed many times by the bedside of someone dying, many whose simple presence shared care making a world of difference, even though it may not have taken away pain or been able to hold back the advance of death.

To know that that there is someone who cares, makes a world of difference to the sufferer. It saves him/her from the awful prospect of dying alone and abandoned.

No particular skills are needed for this kind of presence (I like to call it - ministry). Just Love! Those who truly love offer the suffering incalculable strength, just by being their.
