3rd Sunday of Advent, Year A 14 - 15 December 2019

'Happy the person who does not lose faith in me'

All three readings this weekend have comforting words. Isaiah: - 'Courage, do not be afraid.' 2nd Reading St James; 'Be patient! Do not loose heart.' Gospel - 'Happy the person who does not lose faith in me.' John's situation is very grim he is locked up in a dark dungeon with the threat of death hanging over him. His faith severely tested - he needed reassurance and comforting. No doubt Jesus' words were a source of comfort and strength to John.

The comforting words of this weekend's readings are addressed to us. We need to drink on them, because we too can find ourselves in dark situations. We find ourselves going along nicely until suddenly a storm hits us- the New Zealand Tragedy Volcano erupts lives taken, people lost. Unemployment, a serious illness, a loved one dies suddenly, families are thrown into grief. These kinds of things shatter our faith in the right order of things and even in God. Isaiah offers these words: 'Courage! Do not be afraid.'

John the Baptist was a holy, God-fearing man, yet he ended up in a dungeon under sentence of death. We can do our best, but things may still go wrong. We feel let down by God. We doubt his love for us. At times like these may we hear the words of Jesus: 'Blessed is the person who does not lose faith in me.'

Modern life is becoming increasingly stressful. Christmas brings added work and more stress we may feel overwhelmed unable to cope: In times like this we hear Isaiah say 'Courage! Do not be afraid.'

Death constitutes the severest test of all for our faith. That all of us especially those who have recently lost a loved one, we may hear the words of Jesus: 'Blessed is the person who does not lose faith in me.' Some parents have seen their children give up the practice of the faith. For them this is a great pain and

a great sadness. May these parents hear the words of St James: 'Be patient! Do not lose heart!'

Members of the Church have been scandalised and deeply hurt by the revelation of the grave sins committed by some members of the clergy against little ones. Their faith has taken a severe knock. May they hear the words of Jesus: 'Blessed is the person who does not lose faith in me,'

Alcoholism is a terrible affliction. So too drug addiction. They cause misery to the sufferer and to those who live with him or her. The Alcoholic and the addict have to seek help. It takes courage to admit one's need and to ask for help. May such people hear the words of Isaiah: 'Courage! Do not be afraid.'

Each of us knows the kind of situations that cause us to be fearful and doubtful. We can't stop feeling afraid. But we must not allow our fears to cripple us. Courage is not never feeling afraid; it is feeling afraid and going on in spite of it. Faith is a fragile thing. We mustn't be surprised when doubts arise within us. God will understand our doubts in a world like ours.

But blessed are we if we do not lose faith in Jesus. And twice blessed are we if, like Jesus we are able to show forth our faith in deeds of love and mercy.
