The Relics of St Therese of Lisieux and her parents Louis & Zelie Martin have arrived in Australia and will be on pilgrimage throughout Australia from 1 February to 10 May 2020. The Diocese of Sale will host the Pilgrimage from Monday 20 April until Thursday 23 April 2020.

The Relics will visit St Mary's Cathedral (20-21/4); St Michael's Traralgon and St Joseph's Warragul (21/4); St Laurence's Leongatha, St Agatha's Cranbourne (22/4) and Our Lady Help of Christians, Narre Warren (22 – 23/4) before departing for Adelaide. At this stage there will be the opportunity to attend an all-night Vigil at both St Mary's Cathedral Sale (20/4) and Our Lady Help of Christians Narre Warren (22/4).

Traditionally a collection is taken up at each venue hosting the Relics. The organiser of the Pilgrimage, Catholic Mission, has taken the decision to forgo the previous plan of forwarding funds to Carmelite overseas missions in favour of the St Vincent de Paul Bushfire Appeal.

Alternatively, people who may want to make a donation which can offset some of the expenses of the pilgrimage or support overseas mission can do so on the Catholic Mission website.
