The rite of Election of Catechumens & Call to continuing Conversion of Candidates
St Mary's Cathedral, Sale - 3.00pm Sunday March 1, 2020
'Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant'
RITE OF ELECTION

Presenter: I now invite the Catechumens and their sponsors to stand as their names are called.

Bishop Patrick, Easter is drawing near, and so, these Catechumens, whom I now present to you, are completing their period of preparation. They have found the strength in God's grace, and support in their communities 'prayer and example'. Now they ask that, after the celebration of the Scrutinies, they be allowed to participate in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist.

Bishop Patrick, I now present to you our Catechumens: As the names are called, of each catechumen (3 from the Cathedral Parish: Dean Stuart Brown, Kim Lee-Ann Gleeson and Tammy-Lee Joyce Hanratty) all stand before the Bishop

Bishop Patrick asks the god-parents:- Have these Catechumens been prepared: Have they faithfully listened to God's Word proclaimed by the Church? And have they responded to that Word and begun to walk in God's presence? Have they shared the company of their Christian brothers and sisters, and joined them in prayer?

The God parents reply to each question with the answer - They Have!

Bishop Patrick speaks again to the Godparents as representatives of the whole Christian Community: Asking all present to be with these Catechumens to give an indication of their own approval that they may be admitted to the Easter Sacraments.

All respond with a round of Applause.

Bishop Patrick then asks the Catechumens – Do you wish to enter fully into the life of the Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist?

Catechumens reply: Yes, we do.

Bishop Patrick replies: Then let your names be inscribed in the Book of the Elect.

GREETING OF THE CATECHUMENS: Each Catechumen and their Godparents come to the sanctuary. The Bishop greets each of the newly Elect and their Godparents. Once greeted, the Elect sign their names in the Diocesan Book of the Elect

After a series of questions of the candidates –(the one from our Cathedral Parish: Cindy Pauline Foat) who have already received the Sacrament of Baptism; some in the Catholic Church, who have not yet come to the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, and those baptized in other Christian Churches who now wish to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church says:- My brothers and sisters, you are most welcome............ Take to heart the Word of God as proclaimed and lived by the Church...... With the help of your Sponsors and the Christian Community, may your faith come to a new maturity

### FIRST READING:

A reading from the book of Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7

The Lord God fashioned man of dust from the soil. Then he breathed into his nostrils a breath of life, and thus man became a living being. The Lord God planted a garden in Eden which is in the east, and there he put the man he had fashioned. The Lord God caused to spring up from the soil every kind of tree, enticing to look at and good to eat, with the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the garden. The serpent was the most subtle of all the wild beasts that the Lord God had made. It asked the woman, 'Did God really say you were not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?' The woman answered the serpent, We may eat the fruit of the trees in the garden. But of the fruit of The devil then took him to the holy city and made him stand on the parapet the tree in the middle of the garden God said, "You must not eat it, nor touch it, under pain of death"." Then the serpent said to the woman, 'No! You will not die! God knows in fact that on the day you eat it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, knowing good and evil.' The woman saw that the tree was good to eat and pleasing to the eye, and that it was desirable for the knowledge that it could give. So she took some of its fruit Jesus said to him, 'Scripture also says: and ate it. She gave some also to her husband who was with her, and he ate it. ## SECOND READING:

A reading from St Pauls letter to the Romans 5:12-19

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law. Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift. The results of the gift also outweigh the results of one man's sin: for after one single fall came judgement with a verdict of condemnation, now after many falls comes grace with its verdict of acquittal. If it is certain that death reigned over everyone as the consequence of one man's fall, it is even more certain that one man, Jesus Christ, will cause everyone to reign in life who receives the free gift that he does not deserve, of being made righteous. Again, as one man's fall brought condemnation on everyone, so the good act of one man brings everyone life and makes them justified. As by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience many will be made righteous. The Word of the Lord.
