OUR NEW WAY OF BEING ST MARY'S <u>CATHEDRAL PARISH</u>

Parish life is very different now, and changing all the time.

- From Tuesday 23 June we are able to offer Mass for up to 50 parishioners only. Cathedral Mass attendance on weekends must still be booked on 5144 4100 or by ringing the Priests.
- The Parish office remains closed. Clare is in the Office on Monday's and Friday's as she is unable to work from home. Contact with the office should be via email to sale@cdsale.org.au or by phoning 5144 4100.
- Only Parishioners who have booked to attend Mass may attend at weekends. Please do not 'just turn up' as you may be offended should you be turned away.

- At all Masses, one parishioner is required to act as an 'usher'.
 The role of the usher is to check those in attendance, to remind people to use the hand sanitiser, to direct parishioners to their seats, to maintain social distancing at all times, and to remind parishioners that the Church and toilet area must be disinfected and cleaned after every gathering. The usher will have a checklist to work from.
- We are only able to offer Mass provided we fully meet the regulations set out by the Government and the Diocese.
 Failure to faithfully meet these requirements can result in substantial fines and possibly the closing of our Churches.
