ASKING FOR FORGIVENESS *Matthew 18: 21 – 35*

In this Gospel Jesus asks us to err on the side of forgiving 'seventy times seven.' This means forgiveness must be unlimited. When Peter asked this question he knew it was Rabbinic teaching that a man must forgive his brother three times: Rabbi Jose said "He who begs forgiveness from his neighbour must do so no more than three times." Rabbi Jose said "If a man commits an offence once, they forgive him; if he commits an offence a second time, they forgive him; if he commits an offence a third time, they forgive him; the fourth time "they do not forgive." Look to the book of Amos for the biblical proof of this (Amos 1: 3, 6, 9, 11, 13: 2: 1, 4, 6.) From this we can deduce that God's forgiveness extends to three offences and that God visits the sinner with punishment at the fourth.

Peter expected to be warmly commended; but Jesus' answer was that the Christian must forgive seventy times seven. In other words there is no reckonable limit to forgiveness.

We all need to forgive because at one time or another we all have been hurt. There are some steps we can take, which, with the grace of God, lead to forgiveness and healing of hurt.

We must recognise that a wrong had been done to us - no point pretending it didn't happen.

We must recognise that we have feelings about this – anger and hurt - these feelings are not sin - they are natural and healthy.

We can talk about these feelings - if not with the person who hurt us, then with someone else.

Then at some point we make a decision to forgive. Forgiveness is a generous action of the will - feelings of hurt and bitterness may not suddenly disappear - Healing takes time.

Finally, we have to make a decision about our relationship with the person who hurt us. We have three choices: To continue it, break if off for a while, or to discontinue altogether. Reconciliation is not always possible. It takes two to be reconciled. Unless we forgive others we ourselves will not be forgiven. It is not that God is vindictive. It is just that if we do not forgive others we make it impossible for ourselves to receive God's forgiveness.

It is not a question of forgiving if and when the offender repents. We are expected to forgive even if the offender does not repent – that is what makes it so difficult, and why we need God's grace.

My dear brothers and sisters: Pray for the gift of forgiveness – we must realise that unless we forgive, we will not be able to let go of any bitterness and resentment, and so we will forever not experience the richness of healing and peace. Forgiveness doesn't mean forgetting, it means that generously we may remember but unconditionally - let go:

In this instance alone – Forgiveness is a holy task! We need the Love of God in our hearts, for God alone is the one who can help us accomplish the gift of forgiveness fully.

When we forgive, we free ourselves of the burden of bitterness, and free the other person of the burden of guilt.

GOSPEL:

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time," he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me", he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said. "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'
