The giving of one's word

One of the greatest gifts we can give another is the gift of our word. Giving our word is sacrosanct. We know its easy to give our word, it has no cost but the cost comes later, and that is, if and when we honour our

Some people are very generous with their word, they promise the sun, moon and the stars. But when called upon and they don't live up to their word, their word becomes worthless. It can be very disappointing to deal with these people. Many of us will identify with such disappointments, we may have pained in being let down by those who have failed to keep their word. On the other hand some people test our patience when they are slow to give their word, appearing not to make promises easily. But when they do make a promise, you know you can rely on them to honour it.

In today's gospel the Father in Jesus' story asks his two sons to go and work in the vineyard, one says yes immediately and gives his solemn word that he will go - sadly he didn't go. The other son, gave his word also, he said he wouldn't go, later he changes his mind and goes. Neither son is held up as the ideal, yet we learn from both.

The son who said yes and didn't go is meant to act as a warning to us. Calling ourselves Christian, outsiders sometimes accuse us of hypocrisy because our lives don't give witness to the faith we profess. Sin does not necessarily imply doing something wrong. The greatest sin is not to do good: the sin of inactivity, of doing nothing. We can learn from the son who said 'No' but later changed his mind. To change one's mind is generally regarded as a fault, a weakness. This is not always the case. It takes humility to admit to one's mistakes, and courage to put it right.

The second son, because he finally obeyed his father, is a lot better than the first. Ideally the son who immediately and willingly carries out his father's wishes is the one we should aim at trying to be. Jesus is the ideal Son. Remember, St Pauls tells us 'He emptied himself and become obedient even to the point of death, death on the cross. Therefore, God exalted him.' (second reading)

The parable teaches us that promises can never take the place of performance, and fine words can never be a substitute for fine deeds. Faithfulness is costly, it is not an easy road, it demands unselfishness and a spirit of sacrifice. Even within our own lives whilst in our earthly journey, it brings great rewards in growth, serenity and joy. The unfaithful it would be fair to say have no such rewards. There is no happiness at the end of the day for the one who gives his/her word but fails in honouring it. But! The joy is great for the one who gives their word and honours it. We have heard it said of others he/she is as good as their word - Let us ask ourselves the challenging question - How good is my word?

We answer God's call in our Baptism, Confirmation Eucharist, Reconciliation, Marriage, Single life, Priesthood, religious life – to be his disciples, we know we are empowered to hear God's call through his word and to live it generously in our lives. Ceasing our doubt we live the good news.

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for your past and current support of the St Vincent de Paul Society and its "Good Works". However, we would like to draw your attention to, and provide information of our overseas Assist A Student program. I acknowledge the difficult times we are facing here in Victoria because of COVID-19, but it is even more difficult for the very poor overseas students that we assist.

In 2019, the National Council of the Society requested a review of the AAS program and engaged Coffey International to conduct the review. The purpose of the review was to examine the impact of the program, and the effectiveness of procedures and systems used in administering the program.

The review concluded, "The AAS program is valued and has real impact as intended in our partner countries. The amount will increase to \$100 per student" It has been \$70 per student since the beginning of the program in 1996. However, any amount towards the program is appreciated. The money is used to assist very poor students in countries to our north to attend school, who may otherwise without the assistance, not be able to afford to attend. Any administrative costs are met by the Australian St Vincent de Paul Society. It is aimed at breaking the poverty cycle the student finds himself/herself in, and it encapsulates the Vincentian message of "a hand up, not a hand out".

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.


