The Solemnity of Our Lady of Perpetual Help 14 - 15 November 2020

Gathering

We gather around the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, the patroness of our Diocese of Sale, to pray for our own needs, the needs of our parish and the wider Australian church, our nation and our world in this time of pandemic.

History of Icon

Since 1866 the Redemptorists have spread devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary under the icon and title of Our Mother of Perpetual Help (also known as Our Lady of Perpetual Help). According to tradition, the ancient Byzantine icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help was stolen from a church in Crete, where many miracles had occurred. The image remained in the private possession of a Roman merchant and his family until 1499, when it was publicly displayed in the Church of St. Matthew in Rome between the Basilicas of St. Mary Major and St. John Lateran.

When St. Matthew's was destroyed in 1789, the icon was rescued and hung in an obscure monastery chapel until the Redemptorists learned that the site of their new headquarters in Rome had once been the site of St. Matthew's, the one-time home of a miraculous icon of Our Lady. A Redemptorist priest who as a young man had frequented the monastery chapel that displayed the icon informed his brothers where to find the image.

The Redemptorists asked Pope Pius IX for permission to move the icon to their new church, San Alfonso (dedicated to St Alphonsus Liguori, the Founder of the Redemptorists), which was built on the location of the icon's earlier home. The pope granted his permission and told the Redemptorists to "make her known throughout the world."

In 1890, Bishop Corbett, the first Bishop of Sale, brought home a copy of this original icon which had been blessed by Pope Leo. St Mary's Cathedral was dedicated (and re-dedicated in 1993, after Cathedral renovations) to Our Lady of Perpetual Help and she is the Patroness of the Diocese of Sale. As part of the Cathedral renovations in 1993, a beautiful new Marian shine and chapel was built with the centrepiece being the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, now displayed within a beautiful wooden triptych sculpted by Melbourne artist Eva Schubert. In 1994, Msgr John Allman organised the first Diocesan Pilgrimage to the Shrine.

Special thanks to Sophy Morley for providing this necessary and interesting history of the icon especially for the Cathedral Parish of the Diocese of Sale.

EPISCOPAL ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION OF BISHOP-ELECT GREGORY BENNET AS TENTH BISHOP OF SALE

I am delighted to confirm that Bishop-elect Greg Bennet will be ordained Tenth Bishop of Sale on Tuesday 8th December 2020 at 11am at St Mary's Cathedral Sale.

The ordination and installation will respect the restrictions as prescribed by the State of Victoria. An assessment based on the restrictions as proposed from 23 November will see St Mary's Cathedral Sale able to hold **70 people**.

While we would have clearly liked to offer welcome and hospitality to leveryone, we will be restricted to the Apostolic Nuncio, Principal Consecrator and Co-Consecrating Bishops, Bishops of the Victorian Province, the College of Consultors and clergy required for the liturgy.

Other liturgical ministries, COVID officers, restricted Diocesan representatives & Cathedral staff, and those required for the live streaming will form part of the 70 participants. The attendance of Bishop-Elect Greg's family and friends will be few.

A formal invitation will be emailed confirming the date, time and live streaming details.

We hope you will join us via live-streaming as we ordain and welcome our new bishop.

And so, while the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.
