### OUR HEARTS ARE FULL OF GRATITUDE FOR THE PIONEERING SPIRIT OF THE SISTERS OF OUR LADY OF SION – SALE VICTORIA SISTER RAPHAELA'S MOTTO Fortiter et susviter, = "strength and gentleness"

"Way back in July 1889 Bishop James Corbett requested M.M. Paul kindly consider sending a community of Sisters to his far-off diocese in Gippsland, Australia, Agreeing to the request, Mother Mary Paul, seeing that such an important role needed a leader with great qualities, turned to the young 30 year old Sister Raphaela whom she observed to have the qualities upon which such a request to lead the sisters to Australia to establish a schooling ethos would stand right through to this very day. M.M. Paul trusted the potential in young Sister Raphaela, to accept such a challenge to go to the antipodes for this foundation. Raphaela's consent was immediate – she wrote in her journal - 'if only you knew the tumult that's going on in my heart. In order to find the strength and courage, I think of the fear and pending separation Jesus must have experienced as "he turned his face towards Jerusalem. Following his example, I too wish to follow Him in silence and in Blessing." (Sister Patricia Watson's book Far Horizons.)

The rest is history – this weekend we honour and thank all Sisters of Sion whose grace and mission inspired young lives and established legendary futures still benefiting Gippsland and wider Australia – 2021.

## THE SISTERS THAT FORMED THE FIRST TEAM TO COME TO AUSTRALIA

Sister Sabina:- a novice. Who hoped the Australian climate would restore some of her strength. A talented sister - mistress of music. On July 10 1881 she died - the first sister of Our Lady of Sion to be buried at the Sale Cemetery, just over a year after her arrival in Sale.

Mother Edwardine: The first principal of Sion Secondary College which opened in Bishops House in 1890. She lived the longest of all the foundation sisters dying in Warragul in 1934.

Sister Martina: recognised as a saintly humble Irish Sister who did magnificent crochet- much of which still exists in the Cathedral today: She died 8<sup>th</sup> December, 1932.

Sister Osmond: Hard working and cheerful woman who devoted her life as cook for 34 years at Sale and Warragul. One of the first sisters to go to Bairnsdale - she died in her sleep 13<sup>th</sup> March, 1924.

Mother Charitas: a very peaceful and calm person who came as assistant to Mother Raphaela. She took charge of the parish school in Sale upon arrival. She died in 1923.

Sister Philomena: a very spiritual and hard working woman who suffered all her life from asthma. Never complained and went about her work patiently and cheerfully. She was sacristan for many years and carried out her duties with meticulous care, looking on her work as a privilege to be entrusted with such a function.

## COMING TO COMMUNION - COVID RESTRICTIONS

**SOCIAL DISTANCING:** It is very important dear parishioners we don't become distracted in keeping to the Covid restrictions – especially in keeping to the social distancing directions as we come forward to receive Communion. The Tapes on the floor in the centre isle are there to assist you in keeping to social distancing (1.5 metres).

A practical way of doing this would be to have communicants come forward **one row and one side of the row at a time**.

As you look to the Altar, my suggestion is the **right hand side** be the first row to come forward. The procession to communion to start from the **front seat proceeding to the back seat**. I repeat please be conscious to keep your distance in line with the Social distancing directions as per Covid 19. You will notice the tapes on the floor set there to clearly determine our correct distancing. Come to the tape, stop there until the person in front processes on, then and only then proceed in your turn to the next tape and so on, then to the Priest to receive Holy Communion.

Once the back row of the right hand side is reached, then the back row on the left hand side falls in behind (start from the back row proceeding to the front row of the left hand side).

I am grateful for your co-operation. Should you be available after Mass, would you be so kind as to help in the wiping down of seats and doors and windows – there will be a person to guide you in what is necessary to do – please don't wait to be asked this would be a great help to them. Let us not take their generosity in cleaning and sanitising, for granted. The best way we can show our appreciation is by offering to ease their load.

### FIRST READING:

A reading from the second book of Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy.

Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke through Jeremiah, 'Until this land has enjoyed its Sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep Sabbath throughout the days of its desolation.'

And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: 'Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up."

God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy: when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ – it is through grace that you have been saved – and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus. This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich he is in grace. Because it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit. We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it.

#### GOSPEL:

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.

On these grounds is sentence pronounced that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil.

And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'
