

# GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY WORLD DAY OF VOCATIONS

Today is the World Day of Vocations. Pope Francis tells us: "There can be no greater joy than to risk one's life for the Lord! I would like to say this especially to you, the young. Do not be deaf to the Lord's call. If he calls you to follow this path, do not pull your oars into the boat, but trust him. Let us pray for the young people in our community, and in our families and circle of friends. May our prayers help them to be open to the Lord's call to consecrated life or priesthood."

## Pope Francis – Message for 2021 World Day of Vocations. Saint Joseph:

"The Dream of Vocation 'God looks on the heart (cf. 1 Sam 16:7), and in Saint Joseph he recognized the heart of a father, able to give and generate life in the midst of daily routines. Vocations have this same goal: to beget and renew lives every day. The Lord desires to shape the hearts of fathers and mothers: hearts that are open, capable of great initiatives, generous in self-giving, compassionate in comforting anxieties and steadfast in strengthening hopes.' 'The priesthood and the consecrated life greatly need these qualities nowadays, in times marked by fragility but also by the sufferings due to the pandemic, which has spawned uncertainties and fears about the future and the very meaning of life. Saint Joseph comes to meet us in his gentle way, as one of "the saints next door". At the same time, his strong witness can guide us on the journey.'"

We remember to pray for all our young people in our Diocese and their future. They are the present, future, and hope of the Church. God has a plan and hope for all of them to live out their vocational call whatever that may be whether that be marriage, the single life, and also amongst them are some who would make good priests or religious.

### **COMING TO COMMUNION - COVID**

SOCIAL DISTANCING: It is very important dear parishioners we don't become distracted in keeping to the Covid restrictions - especially in keeping to the social distancing directions as we come forward to receive Communion. The Tapes on the floor in the centre isle are there to assist you in keeping to social distancing (1.5 metres). A practical way of doing this would be to have communicants come forward one row and one side of the row at a time. As you look to the Altar, my suggestion is the right hand side be the first row to come forward. The procession to communion to start from the front seat proceeding to the back seat. Come to the tape, stop there until the person in front processes on, then and only then proceed in your turn to the next tape and so on, then to the Priest to receive Holy Communion. Once the back row of the right hand side is reached, then the back row on the left hand side falls in behind (start from the back row proceeding to the front row of the left hand side). I am grateful for your co-operation. Should you be available after Mass, would you be so kind as to help in the wiping down of seats and doors and windows please don't wait to be asked this would be a great help to them. Let us not take their generosity in cleaning and sanitising, for granted. The best way we can show our appreciation is by offering to ease their load.



#### **ANZAC DAY APRIL 25**

On the 25th April – ANZAC DAY – We remember all those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice in war. As each year passes by, the brave young men of WW1 pass from our sight to become legends of the future. Anzac Day is a time for all of us to stop and reflect on the tremendous efforts and sacrifice of our Diggers to keep the freedom we enjoy today. WW1 affected nearly every Australian Family parents, wives, brothers, sisters and friends were left to mourn the heavy losses for the rest of their lives. Australia lost a whole generation of men 58,961 were never to come home and 166,811 were casualties coming home from the war with broken minds, bodies and hearts. The terrible heartbreak may have lessened with each generation - we can now talk more easily about war - but many of our grandmothers, great grandmothers' families wouldn't speak of it - the pain of remembering was just too much. For many years ANZAC DAY MARCHES slowly declined - but now we see an increased interest and our crowds are filled with young faces. Remembering and honouring our ANZAC memory is a wonderful thing to do. 'Do you think that we'd forget our mate, with the slow march of years? That as time passes we'd wipe the slate, of your sorrow and your tears. Do you think we'd scorn your sacrifice, find no honour in the dead, when your lives paid our freedoms price, how then could we forget? And that's the Diggers legacy, the freedom we hold yet.
