COMPANIONS ON THE JOURNEY

We agree, at times we need our space, we need to be alone. I read recently – 'The Soul requires solitude in order to maintain its individuality' I like this thought - I thought from experience - (in witnessing so often as I do), to be alone as a permanent condition is not good, not good at all. By our very nature, humans are social – we are incomplete, We need others in our lives. To feel this need is not a sign of sickness but of health.

You can be sure, the Eucharist – The Body and Blood of Christ teaches - our greatest need is companionship. The word 'companion' is a lovely word. It comes from two Latin words: 'cum' which means 'with', and 'panis' which means 'bread'. Two people who share bread would never think of themselves as strangers again.

We priests love being invited into your homes over a meal because we know you are offering more than food. You are offering hospitality, trust and friendship. We feel honoured and continue to thank you – because the conversation is as much a part of the fare as the food. At the end we feel nourished in a special way not only in body, but also in heart and spirit.

Here is the connection with the Eucharist - the Body and Blood of Christ - every week we are invited to the Eucharist Banquet - the meal the Lord asks us to celebrate in his memory. It is the Lord who invites us to this meal. In his invitation to us, to partake of the sacred food of the Eucharist, Jesus makes us his companions and friends. (I call you friends' (Jn 15:15) because I have made everything known to you.!

In becoming friends with Jesus we in our turn ought to become companions and friends to one another - But does this happen in practice? So often a person could come in his or her car to Eucharist, and go away afterwards without connecting with anyone!

To build community all of us need to use the nourishment we have just humbly received in the Body and Blood of Christ, to strengthen us in outreach as welcomers and acknowledgers of one another with warm greetings. In that action alone we would immediately get a sense of bonding.

I know currently, social distancing is a real deterrent to being close to others because we have to sit in our pews as far apart as possible. Please do not let social-distancing create an attitude of a reluctance to meet and greet one another - because if that happens we cannot share with one another - Persons could come to our masses broken personally in spirit and loneliness and no one would know.

We need Christ, we need each other. To be a believer, or just a spiritual person, in today's world could be a very lonely business. Here is where community comes in. We need to be a community of believers whose common faith strengthens the faith of each individual.

Think on it, Building community is not hard - became acquainted – we are all called to be welcomers, caring of each other with the unconditional love of God offered to all. We are all called to build community – Companions on the Journey!

The first Christians supported each other, forgave each other, shared their possessions and grew the spirit of community. The Eucharist was at the very centre of everything. (I am saddened, that so many have walked away from the Eucharist - when those we have bonded with walk away – pray for the strength to walk after them, to invite them back, and tell them you miss them, and that they belong. We are companions on the Journey. We are one in the Spirit we are one in the Lord.

FIRST READING:

A reading from the book of Exodus 24:3-8

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that Yahweh has decreed'. Moses put all the commands of Yahweh into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than the one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there,' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.


