

We are called to bring Christ to our part of the world and it to Christ

The Call to evangelize, that is, to spread the word of God, is not limited to the clergy or to the apostles. For many decades the bishops have given priority to the topic of Evangelization and have offered many programs to empower the laity to their responsibility to evangelize. You will agree with me, it is the people in the pews who go home to their families, their jobs, their social circles who are best able to reach out and share the good news about God's place in their lives. Indeed we go back many years to hear again the great words and challenge for us all to rethink our own purpose when Pope St Paul VI made this very strong statement, "The Church exists in order to evangelize."

Here are a couple of thoughts: for us to build on

- 1) Evangelism is a call to preach the word of God. It is not an option. It is a call initiated by God. The call is God's. The response is ours!!!
- a) God chose Amos (a shepherd and labourer) to be a prophet to speak his word. He spoke God's message because God had chosen him
- b) Jesus chose the apostles: They were mostly fishermen, with a tax collector, a Zealot (guerrilla) and a thief - with little education, wealth or power. It seems the Lord picks the least likely to succeed to do his greatest work - he can make use of any willing instrument.
- 2) God calls us.- the second reading gives two reasons for our call:
- a) "To be holy and blameless in his sight, to be full of love"
- b) "To bring all things in the heavens and on earth into one under Christ's headship " (Eph 1, 4-10.) We are called to live in Christ and to bring the world to Christ.

We are called to live the gospel in order to effectively preach the Gospel. Our words should flow from our lives. Our speech is credible only if our lives back it up.

Therefore: A call is an invitation, not a conscription. It is an offer, not a compulsion. It is a challenge, not a command. Answering a call from the Lord is a call to the cross today as much as it was in the time of Amos, the apostles and the early Christian community. But the cross leads to victory, to joy, to peace that comes only by living in the lord.

Ignoring the call may make life easier and more comfortable, but it will not make you happier or as fulfilled, and it will make the kingdom that much less present in the world.

Jesus is the one who heard the call of the Father most clearly and followed it most perfectly. He is the Word, the Good News. He shares his life in the Eucharist with us. Many will share with you that united with Christ, we pray that we may more faithfully live our call from the Father.

FIFTH PLENARY COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA AGENDA

As children of God, disciples of Jesus Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit, the Members of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia are called to develop concrete proposals to create a more missionary, Christ-centred Church in Australia at this time. 'I dream of a "missionary option", that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channelled for the evangelisation of today's world rather than for her self-preservation.' Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium 27

There are six agenda items that the Plenary Council will be considering:

- 1. Conversion how do we meet the needs of all Australians, particularly indigenous Australians and vulnerable children and adults, how do we meet the call to Ecological conversion, and how do we heal the wounds of abuse and how do we partner with and learn from others (Christians, people of other faiths, community groups, government) to do this.
- 2. Prayer how might we become a more contemplative people, committing more deeply to prayer as a way of life, celebrating the liturgy of the Church as an encounter with Christ who sends us out to "make disciples of all the nations"? How might we better embrace the diverse liturgical traditions of the Churches which make up the Catholic Church and the cultural gifts of immigrant communities to enrich the spirituality and worship of the Church in Australia?

- **3. Formation** how might we better form leaders for Mission, how might we better equip ordained ministers to be enablers of ministry discipleship and how might formation better foster the development of Bishops, Priests and deacons as enablers of the universal Christian vocation to holiness live in missionary discipleship.
- **4. Structures** how might parishes better become local centres for the formation and animation of missionary disciples? and how might the Church in Australia be better structured for mission, considering the parish, the diocese, religious orders, the PJPs and new communities?
- **5. Governance** how might the People of God, lay and ordained, women and men, approach governance in the spirit of synodality and co-responsibility for more effective proclamation of the Gospel? And how might we recast governance at every level of the Church in Australia in a more missionary key?
- **6. Institutions** how might we better see the future of Catholic education (primary, secondary and tertiary) through a missionary lens? and how might we better see the future of Catholic social services, agencies and health and aged care ministries as key missionary and evangelising agencies?
