Twenty sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B 25 - 26 September 2021

Mk 9:38-43,47-48 A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS

Some of you may remember the movie 'A Man for All Seasons' - it is based on the life of St Thomas Moore. He was a teenager in England when Christopher Columbus discovered America. Thomas attended Oxford University, and after graduation he entered public life he rose rapidly as a government official. In 1529, King Henry VIII honoured him by appointing him Chancellor of England.

Things tragically turned against him when Henry VIII divorced his queen and remarried unlawfully. To combat opposition Henry ordered dignitaries of state to sign a document, swearing under oath that his remarriage was lawful. If they refused to sign, they would be arrested for treason.

Thomas refused to sign the document - no amount of persuasion would change his mind. Finally Lord Norfolk lost his patience. He said to his friend, "Oh confound all this... I don't know whether the marriage was lawful or not. But damn it, Thomas look at these names...You know these men! Can't you do what I did and come along with us, for fellowship?" Thomas still refused - he wouldn't swear to something that he knew in his heart was wrong. Thomas was eventually arrested. On July 6, 1535, he was executed for treason.

The story of Thomas Moore illustrates what Jesus means when he says in this weekend's Gospel

"If your hand makes you lose your faith, cut it off!....

If your foot makes you lose your faith, cut it off!....

If your eye makes you lose your faith, take it out!...

It is better for you to enter the Kingdom of God with only one eye than to keep both eyes and be thrown into

Jesus isn't telling us to cut off a leg or pluck out an eye in the literal sense. He's simply using familiar expressions of his time to make an important point - which is:- His followers should be willing to sacrifice whatever is necessary to keep from sinning. They should be willing to sacrifice even what is most precious to them to enter the kingdom of God. In Thomas Moore's case it meant sacrificing his own life.

This weekend's Gospel invites us to ask ourselves: How vigilant are we in guarding against anything that may cause us to lose the kingdom of God?

So the message of Jesus in this weekends' Gospel comes down to this:

We should be willing to undergo any sacrifice to avoid sin and losing the kingdom of God. We should be ready to imitate St Thomas Moore who sacrificed his own life for the sake of the kingdom of God.
