Thirty second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B 6 - 7 November 2021

Mark 12: 41-44

One night years ago a cloudburst stranded a newlywed couple on a remote country road. Setting out on foot they reached a farmhouse, greeted by an elderly couple who met them at the door. Explaining their predicament the young man asked - "Is it possible you could put us up for the night?" "A place on the floor or a few easy chairs would be just fine." The elderly replied "We just happen to have a spare room, get your things from the car we will freshen your room up a bit."

The next morning the newlyweds got up early and prepared to leave without disturbing the elderly couple. Dressing quietly they put an amount of dollars on the dresser, tiptoed down the stairs upon opening the door to the living room they found the old couple asleep in chairs. They had given the newlyweds their only bedroom. Returning quickly upstairs they put an extra amount of dollars on the dresser.

This story is a modern illustration of the beautiful story of the widow in the Gospel.

Like the widow in the gospel the elderly couple gave not from their surplus but from their own meagre resources. They gave not only generously but also joyfully and from their heart.

The two stories invite us to ask ourselves how we give. Grudgingly? Dutifully? Or do we give because we want to?

There is another point about the giving of ourselves that we might think about: think on these:- "The best gift to an enemy is forgiveness – to a friend is loyalty – to a child is good example – to a father is honour – to a mother is our heart – to our neighbour is our hand." (inspired by Francis Balfour)

If our giving is less than it should be-if it is less than that of the widow in the gospel, or if it is less that that elderly couple in the story – then Jesus is speaking to us in a special way, directly and personally, in today's gospel. For he has reminded us elsewhere in the Gospel. "Give to others and God will give to you. Indeed, you will receive a full measure, a generous helping poured into your hands – all that you can hold. The measure you use for others is the one God will use for you. (Luke 6: 38). A closing meditation on how God gives so generously to us:

We ask for a flower: He gives us a bouquet. We ask for a drop of water; he gives us an ocean. We ask for a grain of sand; he gives us a beach. We ask for a blade of grass; he gives us a lawn. We ask for something to eat; he gives us his own body and blood.

Victorian Covid-19 Restrictions for Places of Worship

From 6:00pm on Friday 29 October 2021:

- Face Covering must be worn indoors

Hygiene precautions must be maintained at all levels

Parishes should update and have their COVID-safe plans available

If everyone is fully vaccinated:

Up to 500 people can attend Masses, Weddings, Funerals and Religious liturgies indoors (DQ 4), OR outdoors (DQ 2).

If vaccination status is unknown:

Up to 30 people can attend a religious service per facility (DQ4). Up to 30 people can attend a funeral per facility (DQ4), and those necessary to conduct the Funeral.

Up to 30 people can attend a wedding per facility (DQ4), and marrying couple plus those needed to conduct the wedding.

Regional Victoria and metropolitan Melbourne will unite and share the same restrictions, enabling people to travel between Melbourne and regional Victoria.

Music ministry – Singing is permitted. It is advisable to limit your music ministry to a small group. Choir must keep physical distancing of at least 2 metres between each person while singing. Keyboards, music stands and instruments should be cleaned between Masses. Congregation should be encouraged to either refrain from singing, or to do so softly without removing their masks. Please note: Victorian places of worship must use the Victorian Government OR Code Service to check-in everyone including workers, customers and visitors. A COVID Check-in Marshal must be present at all public entrances whenever the facility is operational. You must display signage at each public entry to indoor and outdoor spaces. This must show the venue capacity and that face mask restrictions apply. You must also display Service Victoria QR codes at each public entrance to indoor and outdoor spaces. Reusable and communal resources such as prayer/service sheets, religious texts may be used but ensure they are cleaned between uses. Devotional items may be left in place but should be venerated in ways that do not involve touching or kissing them (such as by bowing or other faith appropriate action).

Bishop's Note: If possible 'Unknown Vaccination Status' Masses should be offered in each Parish to enable the faithful to attend. This must be judged on your pastoral context: e.g. weekday, Sunday etc

Understanding fines and enforcement: Ensure you comply with current restrictions and advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer. You may need to provide evidence of your compliance, including your updated COVIDSafe Plan, work premises rosters, time and attendance data, and other site attendance records. Victoria Police and Victorian Department of Health Authorised Officers regularly check to compliance with current restrictions

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said, 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives', she replied, 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is not his own, or else he would have had to suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

Then he called to his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'
