Second Sunday of Advent, Year C 4 - 5 December 2021

Readings: Bar 5:1-9. Ps 126:1-6.Phil 1:4-6,8-11.Luke 3:1-6

Some insights for our reflection:

Against a backdrop of geography, politics, and history, Luke ushers the adult John the Baptist onto the Jordan stage. John announces the advent of salvation and consolation to the people and proclaims that their hope for the dawn of the messianic time is near.

Advent is the season of Christian "road works," with John the Baptist as our overseer. With John's voice, the Church asks us, both personally and communally, to level and straighten out whatever is an obstacle or danger to our journey to God. We are encouraged to ask ourselves these questions: What are the "potholes" in our discipleship, those sins of omission? From what do we need to be converted if we are to make the way smoother for others who find it difficult to travel to God because of our intolerant or erratic behaviour? Do we indulge in outbursts of destructive "road rage" toward our sisters and brothers as we all try to follow the way of the Gospel? Have we a kingdom vision that can enable us to see around the twists and turns of personal tragedy or ecclesial failure and recognize there - an advent of Christ - his presence with us in the suffering, dying and rising from these painful realities?

In the first reading, Jerusalem is imaged by the prophet Baruch as a grieving mother whose children have been carried off and scattered by her enemies, leaving her without a future and a hope. Jerusalem will also be given a new name that suggests her response to God's mercy: "Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness." Advent is a time when Christians are called to consider ways in which they can commit themselves to "peace through integrity" in different ways, in different places.

Psalm 126 is a beautiful response, a hymn of praise to God for hopes fulfilled and dreams realized. From seeds of tears has sprung a harvest of joy, from mouths silenced in sorrow come shouts of jubilation. That the Lord has done great things for his people is witnessed to the nations, and the psalmist continues to pray for God's grace to flow in unexpected ways and places, using the imagery of streams that would transform the Negev Desert. Together the assembly prays for the transformation of our own tears, and our own inner deserts, and our own thanks for the great things already and so often done for us by God.

From the desert of his prison, Paul writes to the Church at Philippi in words addressed to us today. It is a hopeful letter, full of Paul's confidence in the Fidelity of this church to continue in the way of the gospel so that Jesus Christ may bring his work in them to completion by the time he comes again. Out of tender compassion, Paul prays a threefold prayer: That the Philippians may continue to grow in mutual love; that its members may be discerning of the demands of their Christian life; and that they may be vigilant for Christ's Second Coming, "having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God" (Phil 1: 11). First love, then understanding, then ethics – these are Paul's priorities, for where would the last be without the other two.
