Meaning of the Tabor Experience

Without doubt the transfiguration is a beautiful story. Set on a mountaintop, the name of the mountain is not given, however, there is a tradition that connects it with Mount Tabor in Galilee.

This story which is found in all three synoptic Gospels, is clearly a contrived story. Not to be taken literally, yet clearly something happened on the mountain, because years later Peter remembers it as he tells us in his letter: 'We were eye-witnesses of his glory on the mountain' (2 Peter 1:17-18).

In St Mark's version of it the whole event takes place for the sake of the three disciples. There they were granted a glimpse of Jesus in his glorious state. This was meant to strengthen them for what was to come, namely his passion and death.

What did this experience mean for Jesus? The incident came at a crucial time in Jesus' ministry, having just begun his journey to Jerusalem. Prior to this he had been working mainly in Galilee Even there he had met with a lot of opposition from religious leaders. But in Jerusalem he was walking into the lion's den, sensing and fearing the same fate that befell the prophets — a violent death. The most important thing in Jesus' life was his relationship with his heavenly father. That relationship was the ground beneath his feet all life long.

We don't know exactly what happened on the mountain, we can be sure he heard again the words of affirmation he had heard at his baptism: 'You are my Son, the beloved, my favour rests upon you' (Mk 1:11). On Tabor, Jesus felt himself comforted and affirmed. He knew the Father was pleased with him - with the Father on his side he could face anything.

The story means a lot for us too - like Jesus we too can experience rare moments of light and joy. In his love for us, God allows us to taste on earth the joys of the world to come. We also have dark times - in those dark moments we must do what Jesus did – we must seek the face of God in prayer.

If we do, we will hear a voice whispering to us in our hearts: 'You are my beloved son', or 'you are my beloved daughter.' When we hear that inner voice, we know that we are at home with God and have nothing to fear. We are upheld with the goodness of God.

Those who walk humbly with their God, know they can face anything on the strength of the heavenly Father's love for them.

May our Lenten prayer bring us closer to the heart of the Father.
