Parish Office Relocation and Hearing Loop

At the Parish Planned Giving Information meeting held last year parishioners were notified of the parish's plans to relocate the parish office into Bishop's House. As advised then the key driver for this was the need to remove the parish administration away from the priest's residential quarters as well as to vacate space within the presbytery order to provide accommodation for the Bishop. After much planning we are ready to begin this weeks effect move. the coming southern end of Bishop's House will undergo some refurbishment to accommodate our parish staff, including the parish secretary, pastoral associate, the sacraments coordinator and the parish business manager. A separate office will also be made available for Fr Solomon so that he too doesn't need work in his living quarters.

Works to be undertaken include installation of new data lines, light fittings, blinds, security doors and window screens, repairs and repaint to damaged walls and ceilings, installation of a new office counter, repairs to carpet and installation of a new ramp and hand rail for access to the office entry, which was formerly the Chancery Office front door. Work will commence soon and is envisaged to be completed by late April/early May.

We will keep you posted of the progress of the works and will provide you with an opportunity to view the refurbished office area when complete.

A reading from the first book of Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13
