THE MARRIAGE COMMITMENT

Today many people think when emotional love ends, they no longer love one another. Harold Kushner, an American Rabbi speaks of a young couple who came to him, asking he officiate at their upcoming wedding.

At one point the young groom asked. 'Rabbi, would you object if we made a small change in the wedding ceremony? Instead of pronouncing us husband and wife till death do us part, could you pronounce us husband and wife for as long as love lasts? We talked about this and we both feel that, should the day come when we no longer love each other, it wouldn't be morally right for us to be stuck with each other.'

The rabbi replied 'I appreciate your honesty. But you must understand that a marriage commitment is not just a mutual willingness to live together, but also a commitment to accept the frustrations and disappointments that are an inevitable part of two imperfect human beings relating to each other. It's hard enough to make a go of marriage even when you give it everything you've got. But if only apart of you is involved in the relationship, then you have virtually no chance.'

When two people get married, their lives are linked together. From that point on they have a common destiny. They are committed to one another, and are responsible to and for one another. God seals and blesses this bond. However, the bond is not made of unbreakable material. It is made of human, and therefore, imperfect material.

God made us for love - to receive and to give it. Love is something that has to be learned. The real journey that married couples have to make, and not just them but single people too, is the journey from selfishness to love.

Nothing is a greater challenge to love, nothing provides a greater opportunity for growth in love, than marriage. It calls for a lot of maturity. Gold Fish in a bowl get along easily. But bring two human beings together and you soon have problems. When two people get married they bring to it their strengths and weaknesses, loves and hates, hurts and wounds, hopes and fears. However, the difficulties they encounter can be opportunities for growth. There is more depth to a relationship that has weathered some storms. The fragility of the bond should make the couple eager to seek God's help.

We ask God's blessings on all marriages, that they be happy and fruitful. That their love mirrors the love of the holy family, Jesus Mary and Joseph. May the Lord protect and enrich you all the days of your married love.

TUESDAY 13 NOVEMBER AT 7.30PM

This month, as the next stage in our journey towards the Plenary Council 2020, we begin the series of *Listening and Dialogue Sessions with the Bishop*. The Church in Australia is now in the Listening and Dialogue phase of the preparation for the Plenary Council, where, as communities of faith we respond to the question:

"What is God asking of us in Australia at this time?"

We began our Plenary 2020 journey with the round of open parish information meetings presented by Bishop Pat, held between February and June, and last month, we completed the training for Plenary Animators and Teams in 5 Regional Training and Formation sessions around the Diocese.

Now, parishes and schools are gearing up to organise *Listening and Dialogue Encounters* within their communities and small groups. The discussion and questions arising from these gatherings will form the basis of local submissions to the Plenary Council by parishes, schools, small groups and individuals. This stage of the process will conclude on Ash Wednesday 2019. It will also assist the Diocese in the planning for a Diocesan Assembly to be held on 13th- 14th September 2019. As part of this Listening and Dialogue phase, Bishop Pat is inviting everyone to participate in one of the 5 *Listening and Dialogue Sessions with the Bishop* to be held around the Diocese in October and November.

The meeting outline is provided below. It is important that we use the plenary process for beginning the conversation, so that the discussion and questions that follow may be shaped by fruitful reflection, listening and sharing.

for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.'
