33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B 17 - 18 November 2018

MARK 13: 24-32

Each Sunday we hear the words of Jesus, words that were written by the early Christians which have been preserved over the centuries by the Church. So Christ's promise has come true: 'Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.'

The Gospel carries many stories, all of which coalesce to form one great story – the story of Jesus. While we all like listening to stories we tire if told the same story over and over again. Naturally we switch off. The same thing can happen with the Gospel Story. It may come across as old, stale and lifeless.

How can we combat the stale and weary sense of the familiar? We have to try to hear the story afresh, as if for the very first time. The Gospel is the greatest story ever told. But we need to recapture the wonder of it. We need to release the energy contained in it, if we are to experience the power it has to charm, surprise, shock, challenge, and inspire. We need to hear it in such a way that we are drawn to it, and hear our own stories as we listen to it. When that happens, our stories merge with that of the Gospel, and are illuminated by it.

Everything we need is contained in the Gospel. Here we have the words of Jesus himself. Those who make the book their teacher will never go astray. Its not enough to just turn to the Gospel in times of misfortune. It's not enough to turn it into an object of veneration. We have to examine our lives against the word of the Book. Those words should kindle fire in our hearts, and others must feel the warmth. The Gospel contains only those things that are the best and the deepest in life. 'At the deepest level the teaching of Jesus rings true. In listening to him, you feel you are listening to the voice of God.'

There was a saint who, whenever he was faced with a difficult decision would ask himself : What would the Book say? The answer would come back from deep inside him: you must do what is right and best. So, the Book had an enormous influence on him. It strengthened him in moments of weakness. It inspired him in moments of generosity. It shamed him in moments of cowardice. But through it all he had grasped the essential thing: The Gospel has to be lived.

The Gospel is the handbook of every Christian. The opinions of human being are rooted in appearances and change from day to day, but the words of Jesus do not pass away. We would do well to build the house of our life on the words of Jesus – THE HAND BOOK FOR ALL CHRISTIANS.

If you are not doing so already, what about taking up your Bible daily and giving ten minutes in prayer and reflection on the Words of the Lord

Praying we will all discover (or) rediscover Joy of the Gospel in our Hearts
