Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C 9 - 10 February 2019

Readings Is 6:1-8; 1 Cor 15: 1-11; Luke 5: 1-11. Having the Courage to answer God's call.

Isaiah, Paul and Peter centre in this weekends readings. All three in their turn did great things for God. Each of them had an inferiority complex. Having low opinion of themselves, low self-esteem. They did not put their hands up, but were called by God. Reluctantly they accepted their call convinced of their own unworthiness.

Isaiah said, 'I am a man of unclean lips.' Paul said, 'Of all the apostles I am the least. I don't even deserve to be called an apostle.' And Peter, humbled to be in the presence of Jesus said 'Leave me Lord; I am a sinful man.' For each - this was not false humility; it was the truth.

To their credit, each starts by acknowledging his unworthiness and inadequacy. Spiritually, such a start is ideal. People who put themselves forward are more likely to do harm than good. Such people rely on their own resources, and are seeking their own glory. Pride and self-sufficiency are but sand, and the spiritual house built on them is sure to fall.

When we meet someone who is fearful, reluctant, hesitant, we find that person much more believable and much more human. Paul said, 'When I am weak, that is when I am strong.'(2 Cor 12:10). The meaning is when he recognises his own weakness and turns to God, God's power becomes available to him. When we acknowledge our weakness, God strengthens us. When we acknowledge our emptiness, God can fill us. When we acknowledge our poverty, God can enrich us. Then we become available to do his work, and he accomplishes in us the things we find impossible.

Humility is the starting point - its not that we are bad through and through, far from it. It's just that we are weak, perhaps selfish and cowardly. Without grace, we are unable to save ourselves, much less save anyone else.

However, people can use their sins and weaknesses as a cop-out. Isaiah asked God to choose someone else, someone with a clean mouth. Peter asked Christ to leave him alone because he was a sinner - when we do this we are giving in to our weakness. We are using a ploy to escape from the challenge of goodness.

Jesus refuses to distance himself from sinners. It was for sinners he came. He changed people's understanding of God. God does not shun sinners, God wants them to be saved and generously gives them a new start.

Isaiah, Paul and Peter accepted God's invitation and all three did outstandingly. This is the paradox – strength arising out of weakness. When we answer God's call, God empowers us so that we can do things we never thought possible.

Let us ask the lord for humility to acknowledge our weakness, and for the strength to rise above them. Let us pray

Lord our God, grant us in all our tasks your help, in all our doubts your guidance, in all our weaknesses your strength, in all our dangers your protection and in all our sorrows your consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. May we all have the experience of discovering that it is when we are weak that we are strong, because the Lord's power is available to us.

BLACK SATURDAY April 7, 2009 Ten years ago the whole of Australia identified with the suffering families of 173 lives lost due to the horrific fires which devastated the areas of Kilmore East where 119 people perished, and 1242 houses destroyed

Murrindindi where 40 people died and 538 houses destroyed

Churchill where 11 people died and 145 houses destroyed

Beechworth- Mudgegonga where 2 people died. and 38 houses were destroyed

Coleraine - no loss of life but 1 house destroved

Bendigo - 1 person died and 58 houses destroyed

Narre Warren and Upper Ferntree Gully – no loss of life – but 7 houses destroyed

These figures tells us of how wide-spread the fires were and the many communities still grieving. Stories still told today appreciate the generous involvement of those members in Victoria Police who worked tirelessly - of those Diocesan choir for the Rite of Election at St in the Fire-brigades that came together from all parts of Australia to fight the fires. Of the communities and volunteers supplying relief, through food supplies and accommodation.

FIRST READING:

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings. And they cried out to one another in this way, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.' The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said:

'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said:

'See now, this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged.' Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying: 'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?' I answered, 'Here I am, send me.'

SECOND READING:

A reading from the first Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 15:1-11 Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you - believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God. I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have

GOSPEL:

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 5:1-11 Jesus was standing one day by the lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats - it was Simon's - and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point. When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.
