On page 3 of this month's Sale Diocese Catholic Life there is a photo of our Vicar General, Fr Peter Slater standing with his family's restored icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help which is to tour all parishes as a lead up to the Diocesan Assembly in September of this year. The icon has been in Fr Peter's family for several generations.

Bishop Patrick O'Regan has announced a Diocesan Assembly to be held on September 13 - 14. This assembly while part of the overall Plenary journey is of vital importance inviting all to together to discern and discuss what it is we can do here and now for our Local Church in the Diocese of Sale.

As part of the preparation we are having a Diocesan pilgrimage of the Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual help and the Diocesan Plenary Council 2020 Candle. The Plenary Candle was presented to each Bishop for his Diocese during Pentecost 2018. It has been used at several diocesan Listening and Dialogue sessions.

THE PILGRIMAGE IS TO COMMENCE AT ST MARY'S CATHEDRAL SALE, on SUNDAY NEXT - FEBRUARY 24, 2019.

We will be the host parish for the first week and will pass on the Icon to the Yarram Parish.

I am hopeful all our parish groups and parishioners will come together before the Icon in prayer throughout the week. Our Parish Secretary Clare has been contacting our many parish groups inviting them. Our parish schools are looking at their times for their prayerful presence before the Icon. Hopefully many parishioners will make some time to be present before the Icon through the week of the 24th of February through to Friday the first of March.

On Friday March 1st we will have the hand-over of the Icon and Plenary Council 2020 Candle to Fr Janeesh, Parish Priest of Yarram following Benediction at 12.00 Noon. It would be wonderful if many could be present for that ceremony – more on that in next weekend's bulletin. By then we should have our timetable in place.

Looking forward to a very moving week in prayer as we have the honour to commence the Pilgrimage hosting the Icon and Plenary Candle here at St Mary's Cathedral Sale from Sunday next Feb 24. After 28 weeks the icon and candle returns to Warragul in time for the Diocesan Assembly September 13-14, 2019.
