Dear Father Bickley and members of the Parish Community

SALE COMMUNITY

I have recently advised Bishop O'Regan that the Brothers will close their Sale community in 2019.

It is now nine years since the last Brother, Paul Kane, finished his term as Principal of the College. At that time, the Melbourne Provincial Council made a deliberate decision to maintain a community in Sale, despite no longer having a Brother Principal. In fact, the Council continued this commitment, even when it became more difficult to do so and other communities were closing, such as the one at Assumption College Kilmore. Since the formation of the Province of Australia over six years ago, this commitment has been maintained. We have gladly continued a presence in the school and Diocese.

At the end of 2018, the last Brother on the staff, Br Paul Turner, concluded his ministry at the College. There is no one to replace him and so we have reluctantly decided to close the Community at Sale. The Brothers will leave during the course of the year.

Peter Synan's wonderful 2014 history of St Patrick's, *'Strive After Better Things'* recounts the College's journey. While focusing mostly on the period 1922 to 1973, it briefly covers the years after the merger of Our Lady of Sion and St Patrick's to form Catholic College Sale. The book outlines the major developments and successes of the College, and tells the stories of those who have benefited from the education it provided them.

Marist Brothers led the College from 1922 until 2010, and for much of that time constituted the majority of the staff. During those years, well over 150 Brothers have served the community in Sale, some with distinction, most with excellent intentions, dedicated work and strong faith. I trust they will be remembered fondly and respectfully. For any shortcomings or failures, wrongs or hurts, I offer our apology and our collective commitment to healing and redress.

With its consolidation onto one site and the building projects that are planned to enable this, the College is entering a new phase of its history. Through Marist Schools Australia, we will maintain our co-governance role in the College and a close connection with community. The Brothers leave Sale proud of the College and confident in its future.

I take this opportunity to thank you and the broader community for the support and encouragement you have offered us over the past 97 years. Please keep us in your prayers. For our part, be assured of our continuing support, affection and good wishes.

ST MARY'S PRIMARY Principal to retire after 40 years of service. Cathy Mesaric, Principal of St Mary's Catholic Primary School in Sale since 2011, has announced that she will retire at the end of this year. Ms Mesaric said she was most proud of her student's academic, sporting and social achievements.

"We've had children win the Gippsland spelling competition, and we've had state finalists in basketball and netball.

"We've got a wonderful community, and the children are very aware of social justice issues. Last year the children raised \$1700 that we donated to the paediatric ward at Sale Hospital.

"It's been a privilege to lead this wonderful school. I have a truly wonderful staff, and whoever takes over will be very lucky. I'm sure they'll be welcomed with open arms," she said.

Under Ms Mesaric's leadership, there has been significant growth and renewal at St Mary's School. Enrolments have increased from 143 students in 2011 to 175 students in 2019, every classroom at the school has been renovated, and a new administration block and senior classroom have been added.

Director of Catholic Education for the Diocese of Sale, Ms Maria Kirkwood, commended Ms Mesaric for her outstanding contribution to Catholic education.

"Cathy has been a dedicated, distinguished and caring school leader who will be missed by the many families and teachers she has worked with over the years," Ms Kirkwood said.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'
