How are you coping with Coronavirus Covid-19

From 11.59pm on 31 May 2020 restrictions on gatherings at places of worship and ceremonies will be eased: Places of worship can open for private worship or small ceremonies for up to 20 people.

The strict conditions are these:

- Clear signage around service schedules,
- Social distancing and hygiene requirements,
- Availability of sanitiser and disinfectant wipes and safe disposal sites;
- Churches to be cleaned after every scheduled service or opening;
- Maintenance of 1.5m of separation and planned entry and exit pathways
- All attendees to provide contact details

The Dioceses throughout Victoria share these guidelines – every parish is seeking to keep to these directions, as you will experience here when entering the Cathedral and our Churches.

It is pleasing to see the number of parishioners attending daily Mass either the 9.00am or 11.00am is on the increase. Fr Edwin, myself and Deacon Jithin are delighted to experience face to face attenders. Remember – no Masses on Mondays. Masses on Tuesday to Friday, all masses are able to have increases from 10 to 20 per Mass this is over and above two readers, altar servers, musicians and singers. DIRECTIONS GIVEN TO ATTENDEES AT MASS from MONDAY 1 JUNE

20 Persons only – Plus essential people. Bookings are required - ring the Parish Office on 5144 4100.

1. Upon entry, at the side door near the kitchen, in the foyer – please use hand sanitiser

2. Liturgies or prayers groups with up to TWENTY attendees in addition to Celebrant, Ministers, Door Attendant, Choir etc.

IN ALL CASES THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS APPLY:

Distancing of at least 1.5 metres between attendees.

Signage at the Church entrance, specifying the maximum number permitted at any one time (20), allowing 4 square metres per person.

A Register of attendees, including:

- name
- phone number
- date
- time of attendance & departure

Reasonable time between services to allow for cleaning.

Cleaning by wiping with disinfectant:

- frequently touched surfaces (at least twice a day),
- whenever a surface is visibly soiled
- immediately after a spill.

3. Appropriate seating spaces in the places pinpointed in the Church seats. Families may sit together.

4. Please keep appropriate spacing (1.5 metres) – social distancing – when going to communion. **Please note: Communion is to be received on the hand only.**

5. The Sign of Peace should be given with a sign of reverence for example: a respectful nodding of the head, a gentle bow.

6. Weekend planned giving envelopes, loose collection envelopes or Mass offerings can be placed in the bowls provided at the step near the Sanctuary before or after the Mass.

7. After signing your time out, please leave the Church by the front doors.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'
