Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C 19 - 20 February 2022

I Choose to love.

Praise the Lord, I have had my first family dinner (during the course of the week) since arriving in the Parish of Sale. And guess who invited me out... the leaders of the family group. How fabulous that my first family meal is with the leaders of the family group in the parish. It was a pleasant and delightful evening, with leaders from three groups coming together. The most interesting thing about the evening, apart from the sumptuous meal (it was really yummy), was the discussion at table. It was really very welcoming; a celebration of love and care. I remain grateful for that.

This weekend the Gospel text which continues Jesus' teaching on the plain (begun last Sunday), challenges us in the most radical of Jesus' teachings: "love your enemies", "do good to those who hate you", "bless those who curse you", and "pray for those who treat you badly". I read somewhere of a guru who retorted that this is one of the most difficult teachings of Jesus that he finds really hard to comprehend. Oh yes, no joke, it is truly hard to follow. Someone would say, how dare the Lord asks me to love my enemies, be good to those who hate me, bless those who curse me, and even to pray for those who treat me badly. Isn't that really too much to ask? Of course, it is. This is where radical discipleship comes in. Remember, Jesus asks this of those who are his disciples, those who believe in his teachings and follow him. For these, he leaves his life behind as an example. The entirety of his life has been summarised in this teaching, as scripture declares: what proves that God loves us is that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Rom 5:8); Jesus prays for those who hated and crucified him (Luke 23:24); He washed Judas' feet though he knew Judas was going to betray him (John 13:1-11). Hmmm! Really fascinating, isn't it?

Jesus has given us the profound example of his life. This is why John writes that those who claim to be following Jesus must learn to emulate him (1 John 2:6). Paul in the second reading enjoins us to model our lives on Jesus, the heavenly man (1 Cor 15:49). So, the catch phrase today is "I choose to love". This is the invitation and the challenge. It is God's choice to be compassionate to humanity; and the Lord asks us to emulate our father.

As we join the rest of the church in praying and hoping for a more synodal church, may we be more open to the grace of the Holy Spirit working among us, as we choose to love, even when we are not loved; to respect even when we are not respected; to pray for others even when they treat us badly. This is radical discipleship to which we are called. The response is always a personal and individual choice to make, but very rewarding.

Quote of the Day on Synodality

"The Church, in her entirety, has undertaken a synodal process, and counts on your contribution. Let us recall, in this regard, that synodality is not a simple discussion. Nor is it an "adjective". Never adjectivize the substantiality of life. Nor is synodality the search for the consensus of the majority; this is what a parliament does, this is what is done in politics. (Synodality) is not a plan, a programme to be implemented. No. It is a style to be assumed, in which the main protagonist is the Holy Spirit, who is expressed first and foremost in the Word of God, read, meditated upon and shared together. Let us take the concrete image of the cross: it has a vertical arm and a horizontal arm. The horizontal arm is our life, our history, our humanity. The vertical arm is the Lord who comes to visit us with his Word and his Spirit, to give meaning to what we are living. To focus on Jesus' cross, as Saint Paul says (cf. Gal 2:19), means accepting to place my life under his gaze, to accept this encounter between my poor humanity and his transforming divinity. Please, always leave an important place for the Word of God in the life of your groups. And likewise, leave space for prayer, for the inner life, for worship. I hope so much that everyone will find or rediscover the joy of knowing the friendship of Christ and proclaiming the Gospel."
