Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C 26 - 27 February 2022

Dearest friends,

As we begin, this Wednesday, the precious season of Lent, take your time and read this reflective article by our seminarian, Mark Hughes:

"Remember man dust you are and to dust you shall return" Gen 3:19

Although I have heard these words every Ash Wednesday only after having joined the clerical line it's meaning has hit home. For me it was just something that we did and had to partake of in our preparation to enter into Lent. Now looking back at the words spoken by the priest as he crosses are forehead with ashes brings to light the startling revelation of the fragility of our spiritual lives.

On deeper introspection the saying weighs heavily on the state of our heart. "For where your treasure is there your heart will be also" (Mat 6:21). The dark particles of the ashes resemble the subtleness of sin that creeps into our heart. Sin is subtle but its effects are fairly experiential. Although fine in nature ashes have an irritating, annoying experience when it gets into our eyes as it temporarily blinds us. So, it is with sin and sinful tendencies. It annoys away at the peacefulness of a soul eroding subtly the fabric of our being. Subtle but dangerous is the sinfulness of humanity if left unattended. It gradually becomes an acceptable norm as we grow insensitive to sin's presence in our lives.

The contention we face here lies with our will. The will to do what is right. There remains a mismatch between what we have to do and what we actually do. Scripture calls it out, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom 3:23). Yet again "if we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1:8-10). It takes a humble heart to accept this truth. A pompous person remains dead to oneself and is never enlightened. "Remember man dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Gen 3:19) provides us the incentive to determine where we stand on this spiritual spectrum.

As we come to bear the cross of Christ on our foreheads may we be reminded of the tender loving mercies of our God who gave all for us. For "tenderness and mercy define God in whom doing and being are one and the same." May this time of entry into Lent mark a period of contrition for our many failings. It is a time to take stock of where our heart is and to listen to what it is saying to us. This could be our humble prayer as we make our Lenten offering to Jesus today: "Give us the right disposition, O Lord we pray, to make these offerings, for with them we celebrate the beginning of this venerable and sacred time."

Fortunately for us the Lord invites his people to return to him. His word assures us in the entrance antiphon of Ash Wednesday "when he calls to me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory…" (Ps. 90:15-16). Jesus promises us a renewed way of life in him. A life that is free from the sting of death (1 Cor 15:55). If only we would turn back to him. Like the ashes which require a voluntary action to be brushed away so as to relieve the irritation it causes, may we make every conscious effort to acknowledge our sinfulness, accept its presence in our life and be marked by a conscious movement towards the cross of Christ.

I pray you have a blessed Lenten season, Mark Hughes.
