


I DARED TO CALL HIM FATHER


A couple of years ago, I read a book titled, I Dared to Call Him Father. I found this book very enchanting, inspiring, and interesting. In the book, the author, Bilquis Sheikh, amongst many other assertions, narrated how in her former faith she could never address God as Father. When she encountered Christianity, she was taught to address God as Father, for that is who God is to us as revealed by Jesus. She listened keenly to the teachings. At a point when she was to pray, she began by referring to God as Father. She said "I broke down in tears, because 'I dared to call him Father'." It's been years gone by now, and I find myself still thinking about the book and its contents from time to time. How many times have I called God Father without any real reflection on what that means? Uncountable times, perhaps. I call God Almighty Father, Eternal Father, Loving Father, Compassionate Father, and the likes. |Sometimes, we get so used to something that we lose the meaning for ourselves. The fascinating story of Bilquis draws my attention to this fact every now and then.

Have you ever wondered why Jesus, in the Lord's Prayer, teaches us to call God Father in a very personal way; at a time when referring to God as Father was quite unusual? That was one of the reasons Jesus was condemned and killed (John 5:18). But Jesus insists that we call God Father. In the title, Father, Jesus presupposes a close intimate relationship with God. While Matthew (6:9) speaks of "our Father in heaven," Luke (in today's Gospel, 11:1-13) introduces the prayer by having Jesus say: when you pray, say... "Father..." (11:2). By omitting that phrase "in heaven," Luke wants us to see God not as that far away daddy (away from home), but a daddy who is right with us, in the here and now. Remember this teaching is in response to a request from one of Jesus' disciples. The teaching, coming from a candid and sincere heart, wants to establish and emphasise that intimacy and closeness that exists between God and us. Earlier in the Gospel, Jesus expresses this intimacy when he refers to the temple as "my Father's house" (Luke 2:49). In teaching the disciples to call God Father, Jesus wants the disciples to visualise and understand the same closeness and intimacy with God.

When next you pray the Lord's Prayer, pray it, don't just say it. Make a stop at the opening words: "Our Father." Reflect on what you mean by praying to "Our Father", because you are addressing Our Father. Translate your understanding to your own personal words of prayer when you pray to God, "your Father" who is also "my Father" and who then becomes "Our Father." Build that close intimate relationship with God by simply calling God, Father; and mean it.

A reading from the book of Genesis 18:20-32

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.' The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.' Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord. GOSPEL:

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray: "Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test." He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants. 'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'
