

WHAT A JOYFUL DAY

"This is the day that the Lord has made, we will rejoice and be glad in it," declares the Psalmist (Ps 118:24). Today I invite you all to embrace this declaration of the Psalmist, for it is a weekend of amplified celebration and great rejoicing for us. On this day, my joy knows no bounds; I feel like dancing like David danced... Indeed, what a joyful day!

FAMILY CONVERSATIONS ON **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**. Parish communities from across the Diocese of Sale have been participating in a pilot program since March 2022, which has enabled participants to attend 'Shining A Light' workshops across the six regions of the diocese. Led by Sr Nicole Rotaru RSM and auspiced by Catholic Social Services Victoria (CSSV), each workshop enabled key parish community participants to be better informed and equipped to respond to domestic and family violence. To date, seven workshops have been heldacross the diocese since March, including Sale, Traralgon, Bairnsdale, Warragul, Wonthaggi and twice in Berwick. The intention of the program is to develop capacity for an effective whole of Church response to the prevention of violence against women and children. The pilot program was funded through grant from the Victorian Multicultural Commission. GOSPEL:

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
