NOT RETAILIATION BUT RECONCILIATION (Matt 5:38-48)

This weekend, I'd like to recall the wise and inspiring words attributed to Martin Luther King Jnr which says: "Returning hate for hate multiplies hate. It is like adding darkness to the sky already devoid of stars." Equally uplifting and heartening are the words of Maya Angelou which goes thus, "Hate: it has caused a lot of problems in this world, but it has not solved one yet." These touching words from these two great figures in contemporary human history sure make a lot of sense.

Both Martin Luther and Maya certainly echo the words of Jesus in our Gospel text this weekend from Matt 5:38-48. The exhortation contained in these verses is referred to as one of the most radical of Jesus' teachings and demands of his disciples. He exhorts his followers to not take revenge but instead to love those who regard themselves as their enemies and pray for their persecutors. Humanly difficult, isn't it? But that is what the master asks of the disciples. But why would Jesus ask this of his followers?

Reason it this way: For any community to grow and thrive, it must be build on peace and harmony. One of the great promoters of a peaceful community is forgiveness. Where there is forgiveness, which naturally leads to reconciliation, peace flourishes. The bottom line is the kind of community that Jesus wants for his followers: a community devoid of hatred, violence, vengeance; hatred for one's enemies and even persecutors is also not permitted. Believers in Jesus are instead called upon to imitate our perfect God who loves everyone equally. Jesus thus craves for a community that is filled with love and peace, flourishing on the wings of forgiveness, reconciliation and open mindedness towards one another.

"An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" was the norm of the day. But Jesus wants his followers to go beyond the ordinary every day yardstick. Hence, do not resist the evildoer, turn the other cheek also, give your cloak as well, go the second mile, do not refuse those who come to borrow from you. In other words, no to hatred, no to vengeance, no to bearing of grudges; yes to love which produces forgiveness, reconciliation, and peace. We see this demonstrated in Jesus' ministry several times. For instance on his way to Jerusalem Jesus was refused entry into Samaria. His disciples, upset by this, desired to call down fire to consume the Samaritans. Jesus however proposed the path of love and peace (Luke 9:51-56).

We are human, living in a human society, with human defects and inconsistencies. There are bound to be times when and where we face unkind, unpleasant and uncharitable behaviour, actions and reactions from fellow humans; sometimes from fellow believers. This amounts to slapping you on the cheek, taking your coat from you, dragging you along... The texts today invites and encourages us to, in our community and wherever we find ourselves, continue to be instruments and agents of love, reconciliation and peace.

Indeed, hatred and vengeance is a sign of weakness. On the other hand, love and forgiveness leading to reconciliation is a manifestation of strength. This is what Jesus desires for, and expects of, his followers.

Praise the Lord! Alleluia!!
