

"Go and wash..." (John 9:7): a simple but significant instruction

Last weekend, we read the beautiful story of the meeting between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well; a meeting which led to the gradual enlightenment and conversion of the woman. This weekend, we are confronted with yet another enlivening encounter between Jesus and a man born blind; an encounter which resulted in an open declaration for and worship of Jesus. It is interesting that these two characters in the narratives are not named, but both eventually became radical and charming disciples who were not afraid to share their story, their faith, and their conviction.

How amazing that this weekend 16 school age children will receive the sacrament of baptism (7 others will be baptised at a later time). Also, this weekend our five RCIA candidates/catechumen will undertake their second scrutiny. That is why it is even more amazing that this weekend the church has given us the inspiring story of the healing of the man born blind to reflect upon (John 9:1-41). Unlike the other healing episodes of Jesus in the Gospels, this narrative does not tell us that anyone led this blind man to Jesus; nor does it indicate that the man asked Jesus for healing. Rather, "As Jesus walked along, he saw a man blind from birth" and he attended to him. The initiative was taken by Jesus.

Many people have been asking: how did you come about 23 school age children for baptism? Indeed, it is the Lord's doing. Of course, some of the parents did ask for their children to be baptised. The decision for baptism also came from some of the children themselves and supported by the parents. But in all, it is Jesus who ignites the divine fire. Asked why they wanted to be baptised, the children had very thoughtful and inspiring responses: "I want to know God more; I want to follow Jesus more closely; I want to love like Jesus; I want to be part of God's family and learn more about him; I want to be Catholic, etc. Childlike as these responses may be, they form the core of the invitation in the Gospel text today. Also, listening to our RCIA candidates/catechumen as to why they want to go through the program, though they have their individual stories, in all, it is the Lord who initiated the call, the invitation, and the decision.

Back to the blind man. Having encountered Jesus, the blind man received a single instruction: "Go and wash in the pool called Siloam." Siloam means "Sent." The man obeyed the instruction; he went, washed, and so began to see. I can only imagine how excited he must have felt to see fellow humans standing with him, and other creatures of God. The question now would be: what made him see? Was it the mud? Was it the washing? Hmmm! The mud was applied, he did not see. He probably must have washed in the same pool before. He did not see. But there is another element in his story todaythe instruction from the One sent by God. The blind man listened to this command, followed the instructions, and he was able to see. So, invariably, it was the man's obedience to the command of Jesus to "Go and wash" that actually led to the restoration of his sight. If he had not, he would have remained blind. No wonder, when the "powers that be" tried to ridicule his new found faith, he stood his ground and rather invited them to explore the faith. That is being a disciple. That is the call of the Gospel text today.

Congratulations to the 16 children being washed today in the waters of baptism. Others will receive this "washing" at the Easter vigil Mass. All these happening in response to the invitation of the Lord. Our prayer is that all of us baptised into Christ Jesus, alongside our children being baptised today and at Easter time, will continue to respond positively to the words of the Lord and so receive the fullness of joy in the Spirit.

GOSPEL:

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. Having said this, he spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam' (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored.

His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.' They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a Sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.' Then some of the Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the Sabbath.' Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?' 'He is a prophet' replied the man.

'Are you trying to teach us,' they replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away.

Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' 'Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him.

Jesus said: 'It is for judgment that I have come into the world, so that those without sight may see and those with sight turn blind.'

Hearing this, some Pharisees who were present said to him, 'We are not blind surely?' Jesus replied:

'Blind? If you were, you would not be guilty, but since you say, "We see", your guilt remains.
