

What next could God be up to?

This is the story of a young boy born and raised in faraway Nigeria, in a little town called Otukpo. It is vocations Sunday today so I thought I'd share this story with you.

He is one of 15 children; he comes 12th in the line-up. His parents were not Christians, but sent all 15 children through the Catholic education system. Thus, all his siblings before him were all baptised before him; some of them became altar servers. He was baptised at 14 when he was in year 8, a decision he had to make like all his siblings. His parents had no idea what being baptised meant, nor did they even know when he received this gracious sacrament. He was by himself accompanied by his godparent who was a friend from school. Several others were baptised same day. Shortly after receiving the sacrament of baptism and making his First Communion and Confirmation same year, his life as an active member of his parish church began: he became part of a few pious societies — the legion of Mary, altar servers, the CCR, and the Choir.

Like several growing children of his day, he had his dreams: to become a medical practitioner or a lawyer or an engineer or something of such. However, when he was in year 11, a group of seminarians (students training to become priests) were sent to his Parish for their first-year spiritual training. During the course of the one year, he became friends with these seminarians. He spent time with them, prayed with them, ate with them, played with them. This encounter created in him a new wave of desires. He was now beginning to contemplate joining this group of vibrant, happy, cheerful youngsters who have given of their lives to the service of God, the community and the church. Yes, it was a possibility, he thought, but how was he to convince is parents?

The time came after his final secondary school exams when he had to now make a decision. His parents wanted him to study medicine? Some of his siblings encouraged him to study engineering or join the military. But he wanted to become a Catholic priest. This did not go down well with his parents and some of the older siblings. However, against all odds, he enrolled to be trained as a priest. So, in 1992, the journey began.

Between 1992 and 2001, he went through Spiritual year formation program, then philosophical studies for three years, then one year of pastoral engagement in a parish. Back to the seminary for another four years of study (theology). In October of 2001 he was ordained a priest. It was a joyful occasion for him and the entire family. Unfortunately, his father did not live to see that day. His mother danced and celebrated the day like there was no tomorrow. It was a great day. 27th October was the day.

The days of honey moon quickly passed by and Parish life as a priest began. That will be a set of stories for another day. He served for ten years in his home diocese of incardination. In those ten years, he worked in seven different parishes, and served in other different capacities.

Fast forward to 10 years after his ordination. In 2011, he was sent out on mission to a faraway foreign land. He had to start all over again to learn new ways, new culture, new food, new style of driving (on the left), new worldview, new life. This reminded him of Fr Joseph O'Neil, the Irish Spiritan Priest who baptised him many years ago. For nearly 12 years, he has been serving the church in this new world and enjoying every bit of his life and ministry. He has been privileged to minister in four parishes. Currently, Fr Francis serves the Cathedral community of St Mary in Sale, Victoria.

From faraway Otukpo in Nigeria to Sale in Victoria, Australia. Hmmm! What a call! What a mission! And this could be just the beginning. God indeed works in a mysterious way. What next could God be up to? Who knows?



GOSPEL:

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 10:1-10

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them. So Jesus spoke to them again:

'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold.

All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'
