Have you ever listened to the song, Ubuntu, before? If you haven't please search for it on YouTube, you'll enjoy it. My attention was drawn to it again after I celebrated Mass with the Grades 1 and 2 students of St Mary's Primary School on Thursday 15th June. The opening song for the Mass was Ubuntu. Jithin and I are here because you are. The various ministries are functional because you are. May we continue to uplift the spirit and life of our community, spreading love, spreading faith.




