# Community Update: Our Lady of Sion Convent and former Sion Campus, Sale

In our last report to the community in December 2022, we announced that a Preliminary Proposed Masterplan had commenced to thoroughly investigate the possibilities of transforming the historic site into a state-of-the-art education facility while preserving its rich history.

Since then, extensive work has continued behind the scenes. The appointment of a heritage advisor has been made along with the appointment of consultant specialists in various fields such as structural and civil engineering, electrical and mechanical engineering, building surveying, landscape architecture, acoustic engineering, and quantity surveying. A specialist slate installer has been engaged to inspect the condition of the existing Welsh slates and a three-dimensional scan of the existing convent has been undertaken to better inform design decisions.

Consultations have been undertaken with staff at St Thomas' Primary School, Sale and the Sisters of Sion. These consultations will continue.

As a result of this work, the architects have now moved into the detailed design phase, which considers in far greater detail the impact of design and engineering decisions on the Convent and surrounding site. They have also commenced engagement with Town Planning.

While the project is still in the preliminary proposal stage and subject to further development and regulatory approval, investigations are progressing.

While much work still lies ahead, we are delighted to share some of the architect's most recent concept drawings which provide insight into the opportunities to transform the site into a contemporary learning environment with the Convent and Chapel a centrepiece.

As custodians of this heritage site, we have been very aware of the opportunity presented to us to create buildings of beauty that will enable those in our community to grow in their love of Jesus in an enriching environment.

Redeveloping the Sion site for St Thomas' Primary School would ensure that the 125-year tradition of Catholic education in this location continues. St Thomas' Primary School was led by the Sion Sisters when it opened 50 years ago so that connection would be strengthened.

We look forward to providing updates to our parish and school communities through the planning phase as we progress investigations into continuing the 125-year tradition of Catholic education on this historic site.



# GOSPEL:

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 13:1-23

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables.

He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!'

Then the disciples went up to him and asked, 'Why do you talk to them in parables?' 'Because' he replied 'the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you, but they are not revealed to them. For anyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. The reason I talk to them in parables is that they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. So in their case this prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled:

You will listen and listen again, but not understand, see and see again, but not perceive. For the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and be converted and be healed by me.

But happy are your eyes because they see, your ears because they hear! I tell you solemnly, many prophets and holy men longed to see what you see, and never saw it: to hear what you hear, and never heard it.

'You, therefore, are to hear the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom without understanding, the evil one comes and carries off what was sown in his heart: this is the man who received the seed on the edge of the path. The one who received it on patches of rock is the man who hears the word and welcomes it at once with joy. But he has no root in him, he does not last; let some trial come, or some persecution on account of the word, and he falls away at once. The one who received the seed in thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this world and the lure of riches choke the word and so he produces nothing. And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the man who hears the word and understands it; he is the one who yields a harvest and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty.'
