There are some printed copies in the Cathedral and the various churches. Please fill the questionnaires and return them to the Parish Office, asap. With the electronic copies, simply fill the form and hit the send button; it comes straight to us. Also, please indicate your attendance in the blue folders. That will help with the BBQ following the Assembly (it is exciting to see names already signed up from all the churches. Thank you).

I'm looking forward to a great Assembly with practical recommendations for a vibrant, evangelising, missionary, and welcoming community. Let's dream big, let's pray for it, let's believe in it, together let's work towards it, trusting in the Holy Spirit who dwells in us (John 17). It is my hope and belief that the fruits of the Assembly will take our Parish to another level of engagement, collaboration, and parish experience.
