LOSING FR JITHIN

Well, I know by now most of us (if not all of us) must have heard that Fr Jithin is leaving us in January 2024. It was published in the bulletin last weekend, but even before the bulletin publication, wordofmouth.com had widely publicised the news. In any case, we bless God for the ability to disseminate information.

I saw this coming. We talked about it. We chatted and joked about. Now that it is looking me in the face, the feeling is different. I can't even explain to myself how I feel. You want to let go for the greater good; but you want to hold onto for the good that is eluding you. Anyway, there's nothing I or anyone could have done or say to reverse the decision. It is like what the author of Ecclesiastes says in 3:1-11, "For everything under the surface of the sun, there is a time... a time to hold onto, and a time to let go..." There was a time when we held onto Fr Jithin; now is the time to let go. All we say is glory be to God who gave him the opportunity to serve us in this part of the diocese for about four years. May the same Lord now bless and empower him for greater presence and service in his new parish.

Arriving at St Mary's Cathedral in January 2022, I met Jithin (and Mark) who immediately welcomed me into the presbytery. The next couple of weeks he had to show me how things worked in the Cathedral, ranging from the kitchen to the sacristy. A gentle, humble, vibrant, and well resourced person, he is; equally, a colleague, a brother, and a friend. He can be on the "quiet" side when he wants to... but even his quietness is sometimes loud enough to deafen the deaf. His gentle nature and friendly spirit is naturally contagious. His organisational prowess makes his love of good liturgy unprecedented. I never have to worry when we have church feasts and solemnities. The same goes for the Bishop. Jithin was always on top of everything. Hmm! Challenging times ahead!!!

I cannot forget the memories of our dear Prudence, Dorothy and Nancy. Coming home one evening, Jithin said, I have some "girls" in the house. I kept looking at him for some further details. He went ahead to tell me their names, looking really serious. He said come say hello to them. I followed behind, and he led me to the garden area. When he finally showed me his new friends, we couldn't help but laugh. The three "girls" lived with us, sharing our property till May this year when they fell out with the host just before his annual holidays. We had a good time: we fed them well, they reciprocated the kind gesture with good and precious supplies. Jithin's love of nature is equally evident in the care of our "Garden of Eden" behind the presbytery lounge room, and in the variety of vegetables in our veggie garden which greatly helped the house; and sometimes made available to parishioners.

To say that Jithin is going to be missed is an understatement: the schools (students and staff), the youth ministry team and the young ones, the residents of our age care facilities, the not-so-young parishioners that he visits weekly, the weekday Mass goers, the office staff, Aneesh and Francis (and especially the Bishop), and the parishioners at large will miss him. We thank you, Jithin, and wish you well in your new assignment.

Fr Jithin will assume his new role in the Clyde north parish on **17th January**, **2024.** You all know as much as I do that in this part of the diocese, January is a very quiet month. People go away to holiday elsewhere. But we want to accord Fr Jithin a befitting sent forth. What then shall we do? Well, I think having something done on one of the Sundays of December might be the way to go. This will be discussed at the next PPC. Watch this space for further details please.
