


LENTEN DEVOTIONS

The season of Lent has begun. It is that time of the year when we are called upon to sit back and reflect on our journey as pilgrims in this world. In his 2024 Lenten message, Pope Francis reminds us of the freedom to which God calls us. Reflecting on the Exodus journey, Francis highlights that "Lent is the season of grace in which the desert can become once more — in the words of the prophet Hosea—the place of our first love (cf. Hos 2:16-17). Like a bridegroom, the Lord draws us once more to himself, whispering words of love to our hearts." The Lenten season affords us the opportunities, through the liturgies and devotions, to reflect on God's graciousness and love and our responses to this God who loves us dearly.

This year, in our Cathedral community, we are all invited and encouraged to participate in a five Fridays journey of Lenten devotion and retreat, focusing on the Biblical character called King David, the man after God's heart. The central theme for our reflection is: "A Pure Heart Create For Me, O God" (Ps 51:10). What made David so special in the sight of God? Despite all the choices he made how did he become a man after God's heart? How can we translate this into our own spiritual experiences today? Following on from Francis' reflection on the freedom to which we are called, the story of David gives us a pathway through acknowledgment, acceptance, contrition, and peace. Therein lies true freedom.

As we come together for these days of reflection, adoration, and Mass, may the Holy Spirit lead us gently through our Lenten observances to the glories of Easter. Alleluia! Amen!! God bless to vou.


