# ALONE WITH NONE BUT THEE MY GOD

This is the title of an ancient hymn that comes to mind as I reflect on the Gospel passage of the transfiguration (Mark 9:2-10). I presume you must have heard this Gospel text proclaimed several times in the past, or you may have read it yourself or heard a homily preached on it. No matter what form you have come in contact with this text, hearing it one more time today on this second Sunday of Lent is something special—it gives us the opportunity to reflect one more time on the text and ask the question: what is the Lord saying to me this time. Reading through, every verse is pretty much loaded with meanings. But as you read or listen to it being proclaimed today, ask the question: Lord, what do you ask of me today?

While the transformation or transfiguration of Jesus is the obvious focus of the text, Jesus' change of appearance was not for himself. He need not change his appearance for himself in order to satisfy himself. No. The transfiguration was for the followers to behold so that it might have some effect in them. This is where Mark's subtle message at the very beginning of this narrative becomes very important: "Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves " (Mark 9:2). This was an intentional special moment spent alone with Jesus, away from the bustling crowd, the busyness of everyday life, the noise of the environment; just alone with Jesus. It was this scenario, inspired by Jesus, that enabled the experience of beholding the transfigured body of Jesus; an experience that had an impact on their perception of Jesus.

Every year during Lent we are particularly encouraged to spend quality time with Jesus in prayer. Jesus continues to invite us to spend time alone with him, to commune with him, to enjoy his presence, just to be with him. Quality time spent with Jesus leads to transformation, not of Jesus, but of ourselves. While the Gospel narrative emphasises that the time spent alone with Jesus on the mountain produced an experience of beholding the outer change in Jesus' appearance, today quality time spent with Jesus alone produces inner change in us; a transformation of the heart. It produces not just a change of heart but of the whole reality of our relationship with God, and "my place in the community." The truth is that, the more time I spend with Jesus, the more the Holy Spirit opens my eyes to understand who Jesus is for me, and so deepens my understanding of my identity as a child of God. This in itself is transformation /transfiguration; not of Jesus, but "me". This was exactly what happened to the apostles on that mountain. They saw the glory of Jesus, then wanted to be in his presence forever.

During this lent, I encourage us all to try and spend some quality time, each day, with God. You will not regret it, rather you will want to continue with this new found "hobby" even after Lent. If you want to take up discussion on this, what to do, how to go about it, please do not hesitate to reach out. My strength, my joys, my passion, my ministry, my entire life flow from this: finding time to be alone with God. In the words of the response to the Psalm this Sunday I encourage you: "I will walk in the presence of the Lord, in the land of the living" (Ps 116:9). Let us find time to be in the presence of the Lord, even amidst the busyness of life. It is very enriching.






# **GOSPEL**

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean
