

## REFLECTION FOR GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

This Sunday is traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday. Two major themes emerge from the readings: an image of the one who saves; and the power of salvation itself. The one who saves is not a mighty warrior who comes in military array. In fact, he is the one who was rejected, who was hunted down, humiliated, tortured and hung naked on a tree, there to die in shame. The one who saves is the cornerstone of the building, holding it together, forming a firm foundation so that the structure will not collapse.

The one who saves is a lowly shepherd, entrusted with sheep, not with the affairs of state. The one who saves is an unlikely saviour. This characterisation should give us pause. Is it possible that we have been looking for a saviour in the wrong places?

God's saving power flows from steadfast covenant love. It broke open the world in the death and resurrection of Jesus and it overflows as healing grace. The saving power in the name of Jesus, a name that itself means 'saviour' (cf. Matt 1:21), is for all people, even for those sheep who do not yet belong to this fold.

Furthermore, it is for all time; God's mercy endures forever. Through our baptism we can bring the saving grace of God to a world in desperate need of healing. We can do this in our families, in our local communities, in the workplace, in so many situations of our lives.

ANZAC DAY APRIL 25 On 25 April - ANZAC DAY - We remember all those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice in war. As each vear passes by, the brave young men of WW1 pass from our sight to become legends of the future. Anzac Day is a time for all of us to stop and reflect on the tremendous efforts and sacrifice of our Diggers to keep the freedom we enjoy today. WW1 affected nearly every Australian Family parents, wives, brothers, sisters and friends were left to mourn the heavy losses for the rest of their lives. Australia lost a whole generation of men 58.961 were never to come home and 166,811 were casualties coming home from the war with broken minds, bodies and hearts. The terrible heartbreak may have lessened with each generation - we can now talk more easily about war - but many of our grandmothers, great grandmothers' families wouldn't speak of it - the pain of remembering was just too much. For many years ANZAC DAY MARCHES slowly declined - but now we see an increased interest and our crowds are filled with young faces. Remembering and honouring our ANZAC memory is a wonderful thing to do. 'Do you think that we'd forget our mate, with the slow march of years? That as time passes we'd wipe the slate, of your sorrow and your tears. Do you think we'd scorn your sacrifice, find no honour in the dead, when your lives paid our freedoms price, how then could we forget? And that's the Diggers legacy, the freedom we hold yet. ## GOSPEL:

And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd.

The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
