

Last Wednesday we had the **Parish Pastoral Council** meeting where a lot of things were discussed. Prominent among the items discussed was the "where are we now" about the Parish Assembly. I'm pleased to let you know that the Assembly Implementation Team gave a presentation on the working document they are putting together for the Parish. The PPC was pleased with the presentation. In the next week or so, a presentation will be made to the parishioners, after which everyone who wants can access a copy of the working document from the Assembly. In this way we can all see where we are heading as a community. Meanwhile, following the Assembly, and on the basis of its recommendations, the following initiatives have come forth. The Spirit indeed is alive! Alleluia!!

MAY DEVOTION: WALKING ROSARY - Saturday 18th May. This is the last weekend of April. By Wednesday next week, 1st May, the special devotion to our mother Mary in the month of May begins. During this month, I want to encourage everyone of us to say a daily rosary, especially as a family. There's always a blessing when we pray the rosary. As a parish community, rosary will be recited before Mass. By the middle of the month, we will come together on **Saturday 18 May for a general Parish May Devotion**. A couple of thoughts and suggestions are coming up. Most prominent at the moment is to have Mass in the morning (9.30am), then weather permitting, we pray the walking rosary around the lake (alternatively around or in the Cathedral), then back in the Cathedral for a brief moment of reflection and blessing, followed by a shared lunch. I believe this will be a great way to go—it is prayer, evangelisation, and exercise at the same time. Let's keep praying towards and for this day. Please mark this date and event in your calendar.

AN EVENING OF PRAISE AND WORSHIP: It is always very special and spiritually enriching when brethren come together to express themselves in worship to God in unison. Our friend and brother, Fr. The most important part is the fellowship that goes with it. Very soon, the call will be made for a "come and see" session. 
