The beginning of a new era

With the election and inauguration of Pope Leo XIV a new era in the history of the church has begun. Last Sunday, greeting well over 200,000 pilgrims, leaders from around the world, representatives of Christian denominations, and delegations from other religious bodies, including our bishop, Greg Bennet, Pope Leo XIV marked the joyous start of his Petrine Ministry, officially inaugurating it at the Mass in St Peter's Square.

In Leo's humble words: "I was chosen, without any merit of my own, and now, with fear and trembling, I come to you as a brother, who desires to be the servant of your faith and your joy, walking with you on the path of God's love, for he wants us all to be united in one family." Here Pope Leo recalls the missionary and servant-leadership spirit of St Augustine, the founder of his Religious Order (the Augustinians), who is famous for his words: "For you I am a bishop; with you I am a Christian."

The Holy Father calls the world to love, to peace, and to unity. No more war, he exhorts. Reflecting on Leo's inaugural words, a Thai Buddhist scholar (Dr Boochuay) observes: "By choosing the name Leo XIV, he signals a return to the bold social teachings of the Church — emphasising justice, dialogue, and unity to heal the global divisions of our time." Pope Leo invites all believers to embody the core value of the Christian message: love. He says: "We are called to offer God's love to everyone, in order to achieve that unity which does not cancel out differences but values the personal history of each person and the social and religious culture of every people... The heart of the Gospel is the love of God that makes us brothers and sisters... Together... let us walk towards God and love one another."

May God bless our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, and bring to pass what God wants to accomplish through Leo's pontificate. We are united in prayers with him.



Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'
